

### PHOTOGRAPH HEAD OF ALLEGED THUG

County Doctor Takes Steps to Ascertain Whether Alleman Has Normal Brain.

Although a physician who several days ago examined Clarence Alleman, alleged highwayman, informed the county attorney that Alleman was sound mentally, X-ray photographs were taken Friday of his skull and brain by Dr. Thomas F. Walker on instructions of Dr. W. A. Hulbush, county physician, to ascertain whether a blow received in the back of the head several months ago had affected him. Alleman was arrested by the police after a woman had been assaulted and robbed on the west side. Authorities believe that he is responsible for the robbing of five Great Falls women and two of the victims have identified Alleman as their assailant. County Attorney Bennet expects to file a charge of highway robbery against the man before the end of the week and he will stand trial during the present term of district court.

The sending of pictures to Europe by radio is now possible. Recent tests made at Annapolis, where a fac-simile letter and a picture of the Dempsey-Carpentier fight were transmitted to the giant radio station at Malmeson, France, prove that, with a little more experimenting, all important pictures will be sent by radio instead of by boat.
