Washington, Dec. 10.—Football in 1921 saw its greatest season. There have been seasons in which leading elevens were separated by narrower margins than has been the case this year but the handful of 1921 outfits which may be named as outstanding compares favorably with the best elevens of any year, while in point of absorbing public interest and attendance at games in all sections of the country the present autumn stands incomparable.

In ranking the various teams of the country the task this year has been to some degree simplified by the numerous intersectional games that have taken place. These games, which annually play important roles in a gridiron season has been wholly commendable, marking as it has the flowering of a new sport theory against established facts yet, taking the game of football by and large, the critic who is willing to accept scores as his chief basis of comparison is more likely than not to sacrifice the interests of accuracy for the principles of safety.
