The same rule is followed in all states, the commission stated in making its ruling.

SCHOOL CENSUS GIVES 10,302 IN THE COUNTY

Figure Represents an Increase of 312 Over Last Year; Boys and Girls About Even.

The 1921 school population of Cascade county is 10,302, according to the annual census report compiled in the office of County Superintendent of Schools Miss Jane Keeney, which was recently completed after several months of careful work. This figure represents an increase of 312 over the total of last year, and includes only those persons whose ages are between 6 and 21.

Girls in Lead The census report reveals that the number of girl and boy students are virtually the same, the girls having a slight lead of 16. The number of boys of school age in the county is 5,143 and the number of girls is 5,159. In Great Falls which provides more than half of the school population, the boys outnumber the girls by a margin of 18. Great Falls has 4,197 persons of school age, which is an increase of 146 over the figure of last year, the report indicates.

4,303 Under Age. The census report also gives a tabulation of the number of children under the age of six years, who are not considered when the distribution of school monies is made. There are 4,303 children under the non-school age classification, with the boys outnumbering the girls by 131. Considering \$30 as the amount that is given annually by the state and county for each child, for educational purposes, Cascade county school districts are entitled to \$290,000, which is distributed in proportion to the number of children.


Name Is Botherome, Wants Court to Change
