PARISIANS RECEIVE COLLECTION OF ART OF AMERICAN PAIR Philanthropist and Wife Donate Rareties to City of Paris for Installation of Studio.

Paris—(Correspondence of The Associated Press)—The death of gift by which the City of Paris becomes possessor of the art collections of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Tuck, with 1,000,000 francs for their installation in the Petit Palais, Champs Elysees, has just been signed. Mr. Tuck is an American philanthropist who has long lived in Paris.

These collections include tapestries, tapestried furniture, furniture, pictures, china, Sevres and Saxony porcelains, Batterssea enamels, watches and several articles connected with Benjamin Franklin.

Of the tapestries, the principal piece is "Psyche led by Zephyr into the Palace of Love" and "Psyche showing her riches to her Sisters," manufactured at the Petit Palais, Champs Elysees, and formerly in possession of the dukes of Marlborough at Blenheim.

Among the furniture is a sedan chair, of unusual model, painted in the colors of the French flag, and a portrait in wax by Madame Tussaud, and several terra-cotta medallions by J. B. Nini.

Benjamin Franklin is represented by his portrait by Greuze, another portrait attributed to Duplessis, a plaster statuette by Caffieri, probably a model made by the king's order for copying by the Sevres porcelain manufactory, a terra-cotta bust of Houdon (1778), a portrait in wax by Madame Tussaud, and several terra-cotta medallions by J. B. Nini.

Edward Tuck is a retired banker, born in Exeter, N. H., 1842, who graduated at Dartmouth in 1862, where later he founded the Tuck school, by a donation of \$400,000. He was United States vice consul at Paris in 1886-87. He built the American hospital in Paris and with his wife, Julia Steel, has been for many years a resident of the town of Reuil, close by which he lives and to which he has given a hospital and public park.

He has made many gifts to Malmesbury, a great benefactor to the town of Reuil, which is just outside the gates of M. Tuck's country house, among them, the iron bed on which Napoleon died and a rose garden containing all the kinds of roses that Josephine once grew there.

Shanghai Welcomes Trade Missionaries From Pacific Coast Shanghai—(Correspondence of The Associated Press).—Enthusiastic greeting was given in China to the California trade delegation, representing the San Francisco chamber of commerce and important Pacific coast commercial interests, which is continuing a tour of the far east begun in October. After leaving Shanghai the delegation, which numbers 135 persons, proceeded to Hongkong and Canton and before returning on the homeward trip will visit Singapore, Java and Manila.

Charm Guards Life of Last of Wild Cattle in Hawaii Honolulu—(Correspondence of The Associated Press).—Hunters and poachers gradually are clearing the wild sections of the Hawaiian archipelago of all game, but the last of the wild cattle resulting from the herds started here by visiting explorers years ago, is not yet extinct. It is being guarded by hunters from the island of Kauai, "Bipi's" stamping ground.

"Bipi" is a white marked bull and is an excellent target, hunters say. Early every hunter who has visited Kauai is believed to have taken at least one shot at him, and numerous traps have been set for him, but he has evaded both bullets and guile. "Bipi" is king of the Alakai swamp at the head of the Katalau valley, where scores of pursuers were held by his cunning and tenacity.

Officials of the Hawaiian fish and game commission said that "Bipi" is the last known descendant in the territory of the cattle that were placed on the islands of Kauai and Hawaii by Captain Cook, the British navigator, who met his death on his second visit to these islands.

Germans Pick Up Business Threads War Lost in China London—(Correspondence of The Associated Press).—The Germans are gradually returning to China and picking up the threads of their former business; not trading for the present under their own names, but in partnership with Chinese, says a report on the commercial situation of China by H. H. Fox, commercial counselor of the British legation in Peking.

German drugs and sundries are beginning to appear on the Shanghai market, the report goes on, and it is stated that several important orders for machinery and electric plants have recently been booked by German firms.

There is no doubt, the report says, that the Germans, assisted by the comparative cheapness of their products, will gradually recover the share they hold in China's foreign trade before the war, but the process will be slow, as they have lost valuable connections, which have laboriously built up have been shattered, and they have suffered a serious loss of prestige in the eyes of the Chinese.

French Fur Trade Profits Receding Says Paris Report Paris—(Correspondence of The Associated Press).—For the three years, 1918, 1919 and 1920, enormous profits were realized in the French fur trade but the rise in prices seems to have passed its highest point this year.

A Hudson bay otter cloak which cost 12,000 francs in April, 1920, can now be bought for 5,000. Rabbit skins, which had reached fancy prices, have returned to the normal of before the war. Astrakhan and skunks are now only twice their pre-war prices and blue and white fox three to four times.

Siberian sables and Peruvian chinchilla alone continue to increase in price, both being rare and much in demand. A sable cloak, which cost 80,000 francs in 1913-14, would cost only 500,000.
