

Shipping Board Buys 11,000,000 Barrels of Oil; Prices Varied

Washington, Nov. 16.—Shipping board contracts for more than 9,000,000 barrels of fuel oil, as announced Thursday by Chairman Lasker of the shipping board, call for the Union Oil company to furnish during the next 18 months 600,000 barrels per year at Pacific ports at prices ranging from \$1 to 92 cents a barrel.
