NEW ROLLING STOCK TO CUT CAR SHORTAGE

**Milwaukee Places Large Order
With North Montana Area
to Benefit.**

Again, and for the third time in about as many months, the Milwaukee railroad announced the purchase of a large volume of new rolling stock for use in the North Montana area. The latest purchase includes 75 engines, 5,000 gondolas, 2,000 box cars and 500 automobile cars. This news is contained in an announcement received at the Northern Montana office of the road here from J. R. Veitch, assistant traffic manager, with offices in Seattle.

The new engines are of the type known as Mikados, being large, light duty engines designed for freight use. The gondolas are for transporting coal and ore. The 2,000 box cars are of the type used for wheat, and will add materially in another season to the rolling stock of the western carriers covered by the Milwaukee. The automobile cars are end door carriers. No date is announced for delivery of these by the contractors to the railroad, merely that the order has been placed.

Before there had been any settlement of the strike the Milwaukee announced, early in September, that 4,000 box cars had been ordered for use at the rate of 100 a day, the majority of them coming into Montana to relieve the car shortage for moving wheat. Although deliveries were not according to schedule, it was the receipt of these cars which helped materially to relieve an alarming tie-up and which enabled the Northern Montana division to block its elevators much sooner than would have otherwise been the case. Another announcement, later in the fall, told of orders placed for several thousand more cars. This included, box, gondola and refrigerator orders.

While the latest order may not materialize in the point of visible rolling stock for several months, the entire policy of the Milwaukee as regards equipment is to insure adequate cars for the coming year without a car shortage as was experienced in 1922, and it is announced that the Northern Montana division will equip its share of new additions to equipment.
