Crown Prince Breaks Into Print With Unexpected Results.

HE CRITICIZES COUNT FRIS THE COUNT MAKES REPLY AND TONGUES ARE SET WAGGING AT A FURIOUS RATE.

A hornet's nest of particularly active boreas was stirred up by the crown prince of Denmark when he undertook to criticize in the Berlingske Tidende, the action of Count Fris and eight other members of the conservative party who withdrew in order to oppose the government. The king and the members of the royal family are supposed to have no political preferences; or, at least, are forbidden to give public utterance to them. This rule is so closely adhered to that when it was known that the crown prince was the author of an anonymous article in the above paper, every one was astonished. It did not take long, however, before the tongues were wagging briskly. The liberals were hot, the conservatives deeply chagrined, the famous nine were saucy and Count Fris did not hesitate to reply to the crown prince's maiden effort as a political writer. In view of the bitterness shown on all sides it is certain that the royal politician committed the gravest sort of a blunder, for even those who are glad to worship at the feet of royalty have no apologies for the interference of his highness.

After Count Fris and his eight associates rejected the government's tax law and decided to support the plan of the Folketing for the appointment of a commission to prepare a tax law he was harshly criticized and attention was called to the fact his famous father in 1865 during a heated political campaign declared that he regarded his king with all he owned. The younger count was accused of being unworthy of such a sire. To this the count replied that he would be far from the king as he was "I and my house and all I have will serve old Denmark."

Then the crown prince conceived the idea that he must break all the traditions of his house and country. He sent for a reporter and dictated an attack on Count Fris in which he argued that the count's explanation was irrelevant, as the fatherland and king were the same, at least that was the old count's view. From all corners of the kingdom he heard that there was a great deal of difference between Denmark and the king was the same, and the point made by the royal contributor to the press aroused much hostility of opinion.

In the same article the prince declared that the man who would not work in accordance with the government's bill was no longer a member of the right party, but a traitor at home among the liberals and the socialists. The idea that the side independents had disgraced themselves and were fit only for liberals and socialists naturally provoked the members of this strongest of the political parties. The royal ears have been burning ever since.

In the excitement there were several demands that the prince should be deposed, but the ministers could not hear and are still hanging on to their portfolios with the grip of death.

ZORN'S BRUSH

Its Magic Frequently Brings the Owner \$15,000 a Week.

Anders Zorn, the Swedish painter and etcher, who was a member of the Carnegie art jury will exhibit fifteen recent portraits and a number of studies at the Durand-Riel galleries in New York from Feb. 15 to March 2. Some interesting stories are told in New York papers regarding Mr. Zorn's financial success. Besides getting very high prices for his portraits, Mr. Zorn is a rapid worker. It is freshly reported that in the course of a single week's painting, among the socially elect of Boston, this summer, were more than \$15,000. Among the portraits at the Durand-Riel gallery next month will be those of ex-President Cleveland and Mrs. Cleveland, which attracted a good deal of attention at the Pittsburg exhibition. Mr. Zorn's art was introduced into the United States by the artist, painter, etcher and engraver, and especially in that of Mr. Cleveland, compares well with that of nearly any portrait painter now in this country. Mr. Zorn regards himself as essentially a portrait painter, though his etchings have attracted widespread attention. An exhibition in this line was recently made in New York.

Fight for County Option.

County option is still the aim of the Minnesota Total Abstinence Society through its local societies and its permanent lecturers, E. E. Lobeck and T. O. Kjos, a determined campaign has been fought and the work will be carried into the legislature, which will be requested to pass a bill authorizing counties of over 5,000 population, by a popular vote, to either prohibit or not the liquor traffic shall be prohibited within their respective limits. Secretary Skordal has distributed 6,000 petitions, the most active workers in the society and these have been busy for some time in circulating them. A formidable showing will be made before the legislature.

Hamellet Relics Plenty.

The Century Magazine for this month has an article by Jacob A. Riis, of New York, on Hamletlet's Relics, in which he describes a task which was easy for Mr. Riis, as his boyhood days were spent in Kronborg, the castle of the city in which he mentioned a visit by a number of English actors to Shakespeare's day, and it is not impossible that some of the relics were among them. Hamletlet's grave has always been a Mecca for English tourists, and the gravestones have been taken to pieces for souvenirs until finally the citizens tired of erecting new gravestones and refused to permit the taking of any more from the glass works. This made it very convenient for the tourists and soon afterwards the gravestones were supplied with new ones which can be renewed without expense.

The Odin Will Dance.

Invitations have been issued by the Odin Club for a twentieth century ball, to be held at the clubrooms, 13 Seventh street S. It will be the first social event in Scandinavian circles this season and invitations are in much sought after. The arrangements are in charge of the committee consisting of Henry J. Gjertsen, chairman; Lieutenant N. P. Fredson, Jacob Jacobson, A. W. Skog and Ned W. Cappelen.
