Senate Bills. 42—Appropriation for per diem and mileage of members of the committee on houses...

House Bills. 13—Fixing terms of court in the third judicial circuit. 22—Fixing dates of terms of court in the second judicial circuit.

43—Fixing the salaries of the governor and supreme and circuit judges. 44—Creating a law department at the state university.

45—Appropriation for the expense of advertising sale and lease of public lands. 46—Providing for collection of delinquent personal property tax by sheriffs instead of treasurer.

47—Appropriation of money to reimburse counties and persons who assisted in returning troops from San Francisco to the state.
