D. A. R. LISTENS TO REPORTS

Mrs. Nesbith Resents Attack on Board of Officers—Mrs. Manning on Continental Hall.

Washington, Feb. 20.—The national society of the Daughters of the American Revolution today convened with the intention of completing the reading of all reports to clear the way for the event of the congress, the election of officers to-morrow.

Yesterday was occupied chiefly with the reading of reports. The report of the vice president general in charge of organization of chapters states that there are now 567 organized chapters and 77 unorganized chapters, a total increase of 55.

The registrar general, in her report, stated that during the past year 3,873 members had been admitted and that during the last three years 12,759 women had become daughters.

The reports showed New York state to have the largest membership, there being forty-four chapters with 3,520 members. The most rapid growth was shown in some of the western states.
