Little Interest in the Steel Stocks but They Show Better Support Than for Some Days.



Flax-The market is quiet. Prices were about in the same range as yesterday, with a few exceptions on some sales.

Closing prices were: Minneapolis-Cash, \$1.12 to arrive, \$1.17; Duluth-Cash, \$1.10; to arrive, \$1.15; May, \$1.14; September, \$1.16.
