WORK OF LIPTON'S SHAMROCK II.

Great Britain Behind American in Yacht Building, Says an Expert. London, March 12.—Some of the papers here quote a Glasgow correspondent, who says that unseasonable difficulties have arisen in connection with the plating of Shamrock II. He states that Mr. Watson discovered serious flaws in some of the plates, and that he now inspects every inch of the metal used. He has made an important discovery which upsets many theories of yacht designing. He has been obliged to discard aluminum plating for the deck.

Glasgow, March 12.—In a lecture delivered at the university here, John Howard Hiles, consulting naval architect, contrasted British and American yacht construction. He stated that Great Britain had always been several years behind the United States. The plea that British yachts competing in the United States were obliged to cross the Atlantic had served as an excuse too long. There had been a steady development in the direction of lighter hulls and more sail, but the British have yet behind the Americans. The problem was to get the weight without reducing the strength.

A KENNEL ASSOCIATION

St. Paul Dog Fanatics Discussing the Organization of One. St. Paul dog fanciers will meet at the Aberdeen hotel in a few days to consider the proposition to form a kennel association. The purpose of the proposed association is to hold regular meetings for the purpose of discussing the interests of the dog fanciers of the city. The promoters are figuring on a limited liability company with 1,000 shares at \$5 per share. The organization would be in the form of a corporation. It is believed that with \$5,000 back of it, an association could put on field trials and bench shows of the class that would draw the exhibitors and the public and become self-supporting.
