ALLIANCE TO STAND

French View Is That the Triple Compact Will Be Renewed.

THE PRESENT POSITION OF ITALY

Europe Is Speculating on the Meeting of Von Buelow and Zanardelli.

New York Sun Special Service

Paris, April 2.-A diplomat says in regard to the reported break up of the triple alliance, and his words may be taken as representing the views of the French foreign office:

The triple alliance is just as certain to be renewed as it is certain that the Italian will rise to-morrow. When the triple alliance was made, Italy, rightly or wrongly, was induced to suppose that France was about to invade her territory, while Russia attacked Austria.

Italy therefore hung herself practically unconditionally into the arms of Germany, who reaped the benefits, while Italy paid the costs.

To-day Italy is assured of the pacific intentions of France and is consequently free to consider other than her actual safety.

Meantime Austria has announced her intention of omitting the clause in her tariff laws giving preferential duties to Italian wine. This, of course, one of Italy's most important industries, she desires to protect.

The declaration of Premier Zanardelli, therefore, in regard to Italy's position is regarded as a fine specimen of diplomatic "bluff" and as showing Italy's determination to re-enter the triple alliance on fair terms.

Italy foresees the danger if her commerce is excluded from the Balkan peninsula by the southern extension of the influence of Austria and Germany. This can be counteracted by joining hands with Russia, and hence King Victor Emmanuel has invested largely in the Antivari and Varna railway.

Italy looks on the renewal of the triple alliance with the utmost indifference, believing that the compact does not contain a compact signed by Italy antagonistic to France. The report that Italy is to enter an alliance with France and Russia, and she is prepared to renew the latter only on terms that will not interfere with her good relations with France.

EUROPE ALL AGOG

Short Meeting of Von Buelow and Zanardelli.

New York Sun Special Service

Verona, April 2.-Count von Buelow, the German ambassador, who is visiting Venice, met Signor Zanardelli, Italian prime minister, here. The two statesmen had a brief interview.

Rome, April 3.-It is generally assumed that a brief meeting of Prime Minister Zanardelli and Chancellor von Buelow at Verona was connected with politics, but what could be achieved in a fifteen-minute chat it is difficult to imagine.

The meeting, however, furnishes an opportunity for the writers of political gossip to speculate on the pending Italo-German commercial treaty and the renewal of the triple alliance.

The forthcoming visit of an Italian squadron to Toulon is treated by those that desire a Franco-Italian alliance as an event of the utmost international importance.

Meanwhile there is nothing at present to indicate that the renewal of the triple alliance was anything further than one of courtesy.

Berlin, April 3.-Semi-official papers seek an antidote for the political gossip arising from Chancellor von Buelow's visit to Venice by declaring that he is regularly taking an Easter holiday and that he will return in a week.

Berlin, April 3.-The Lokalanzeiger understands that the conference between the imperial chancellor, Count von Buelow and Signor Zanardelli, the Italian premier, at Verona, was intended to remove the false impression created by insinuations in the press of France regarding the relations between Italy and Germany.

The paper interprets the meeting as insuring the continuance of thoroughly friendly relations between the two countries. In official circles it is admitted that the relations between the two countries were discussed, Signor Zanardelli, it is said gave satisfactory assurances.

PLANS A NEW MOVE

Conquest and Pacification of the Northern Transvaal.

KITCHENER'S NEW CAMPAIGN

London Interpretation on the Occupation of Nylstroom-Potgieter Surrenders.

New York, April 3.-The news from Lord Kitchener that General Plumer has occupied Nylstroom is taken to mean, the London correspondent of the Tribune says, that the British army in South Africa has triumphed over the northern advance toward Pietersburg.

Nylstroom is situated a little way off the railway about ninety miles north of Pretoria. It was held for a few days by General Baden-Powell in August last year, but had to be evacuated because the force then at Lord Roberts' disposal was insufficient to secure the railway line northward to the sea.

There can be little doubt that Lord Kitchener's latest report indicates the execution of a comprehensive plan for the conquest and pacification of the northern Transvaal.

With the occupation of Pietersburg main trunk lines of railway would be lost to the Boers, but there is a heavy task in the protection of the line of communication 240 miles long that would be added to the burdens of the British army.

London, April 2.-A dispatch to the Daily Mail from Pretoria says that Colonel Plumer's operations at Warm Baths en route to Nylstroom resulted in the surrender of George Grobler, a brother of General Grobler, and Nicholas Potgieter, with more than 100 followers.

A telegram from Bloemfontein reports the capture of a Boer laager at Bochberg, Sixty miles north of Nylstroom.

Newcastle, Natal, April 3.-The Boers derailed and wrecked a train near Mount Prospect. Subsequently General Campbell's column attacked them and heavy fighting ensued. General Campbell being at a disadvantage. The result is not known here.

SHUT OFF THE MULES

Application for an Injunction Is Made at New Orleans.

New Orleans, April 2.-Proceedings were brought in the United States court here by representatives of the Boers to prevent the sailing of the steamship Anglo-Australian, loaded with mules, consigned to the British in South Africa. Judge Parlane issued an order requiring the defendant to show cause April 6 why the preliminary injunction should not be granted.

The petition says that if the British supplies are shut off in America the war will cease.

NO OTHER PEACE TERMS

Further Concessions Would Only Make England Ridiculous.

London, April 3.-In a desultory debate in the House of Commons on the conduct of the South African War, the Honorable William St. John Broderick, secretary of state for war, said that further concessions by Great Britain would only make England ridiculous in the eyes of the civ-
