RAILROAD RUMBLES.

THEY'LL MAKE RATES

Transcontinental Passenger Association to Meet Monday.

San Francisco, April 12.—Railroad business of great importance will be transacted at the Trans-Continental Passenger meeting that opens at Delmonico, Monday.

Among the subjects on the program are rates for the general convention of the Episcopal church, which will be held in

this city in October; for the biennial meeting of the Knights of Pythias to be held in San Francisco in 1902; for the general assembly of the Presbyterian church, to be held in Los Angeles in May, 1902; for the convention of the Federation of Great Northern lines, over the Pacific and the North-Western territory, The Milwaukee and the North-Western will be greatly affected by a deal which routes traffic originating along the Northern Pacific and Great Northern lines, over the Burlington and Chicago, and it is probable that they will try to effect an understanding with other roads to play even.

C. M. & ST. P. AND NORTH-WESTERN Will Have to Make Combinations for Mutual Protection.

New York, April 12.—The consummation of the Burlington deal, which everybody seems to expect, may induce other combinations of railroad properties operating in the northwestern territory. The Milwaukee and the North-Western will be greatly affected by a deal which routes traffic originating along the Northern Pacific and Great Northern lines, over the Burlington and Chicago, and it is probable that they will try to effect an understanding with other roads to play even.

B. C. H. & N. Terminals.
