SMITH MAY DIE American Pugilist Knocked Out by Jack Roberts. Billy Smith, the American, went down before Jack Roberts of England in the eighth round at the National Sporting Club, London, last night. The fight was for the title of champion of the world. Smith looked like a champion, but he was knocked out in the eighth round, being much the weaker of the two. After the fourth round he was apparently well pleased, and from then on he fought with a confidence that he had dislocated his right arm at the fourth round and both legs were badly hurt. He was removed to a hospital, where he rallied slightly later, but in spite of the rally the surgeons at the hospital take the most serious view of his condition. At 1 o'clock this afternoon he was still unconscious.

THAMES SAILING RECORD Gollan, a New Zealand Amateur, Takes It. New York Sun Special Service. London, April 22. The latest Thames sailing record was established to-day by Gollan, a New Zealand amateur, in a match against the professional oarsman Tommas and Sullivan. The course was from Oxford to Putney, a distance of 104 miles, including 34 locks, which, however, were opened by arrangement. A strong stream favored the oarsmen. Gollan's time was thirteen hours, fifty-seven minutes. When he crossed the finish line he was almost dead beat. The best previous time, which was made under more adverse conditions, was by Lehmann of Holland, when he rowed the distance in 1559. His time was twenty-two hours and thirty minutes.
