TEACHERS PROTEST

Sable Cuticle Precipitates One More Lively Row.

A COLORED MUSIC INSTRUCTOR

New York School Principals Indignantly Declare They Won't Stand It.

New York, May 7.—The Herald says that because Richard M. Robinson, a colored teacher of music, has been assigned to supervise the musical instruction given in the schools under their control, eighteen principals have protested. They have the active sympathy of two hundred and thirty teachers, and as a result, Borough Superintendent John Jasper has decided to change his schedule and send Mr. Robinson to other schools. Protests, however, are expected, no matter what action is taken.

Until recently Mr. Robinson taught music in public school No. 30, which is attended by few white children. He had been employed there for nearly twenty years. The charter amendment to the Davis school law making all special teachers assistant supervisors, made Mr. Robinson assistant to Supervisor of Music Frank Damrosch. His salary was increased and he is now to give his entire time to teaching the teachers and criticizing the work of their pupils.

Superintendent Jasper picked out eighteen schools and the principals met Mr. Damrosch last week in the hall of the board of education. They were informed that Mr. Robinson would be assistant supervisor of music in their schools. Superintendent Jasper told the teachers who were angered if they had valid objections to put them in writing. Mr. Robinson that day made the rounds of the schools to which he had been assigned, but he was received with marked coldness.

The principals consulted their subordinates and Superintendent Jasper received eight protests. Superintendent Jasper has replied to all that he will deal vigorously if any insubordination is shown and he advises the teachers to put up with the existing conditions until a remedy can be found.

JONES DECLINES FOOD

RICE'S VALET TIRED OF LIFE

Sensational Conduct of the Principal Witness Against Lawyer Patrick.

New York, May 7.—Refusing to touch a mouthful of food, Valet Charles F. Jones, the self-confessed murderer of William Rice, who once before attempted to kill himself in the Tombs by cutting his throat, is slowly starving to death in the house of detention. Jones is the state's principal witness against Albert T. Patrick, now under indictment for murder. Jones, at Patrick's preliminary hearing, told in a dramatic manner of Rice's murder. This was the third confession of Jones.

After making a previous statement accusing Patrick he thrust a penknife deep into his throat. The knife, he swore, was given him by Patrick, who, he claimed, had also agreed to commit suicide with him.

For five days, Jones has eaten no solid food. Nothing but vichy water and milk has passed his lips. It had been feared that the environment of the Tombs would prey upon Jones, so an extra valet had been had been exerted to keep the valet in good spirits. Of late, however, he had grown despondent and has brooded much over his crime.

Jones is so weak that he is unable to raise his head from his pillow. He will be removed to a sanatorium, and in order to keep him alive, artificial means of giving sustenance to him will be resorted to.

NOT MARRIED YET

Story of the Union of Herron and Miss Rand Denied.

Keokuk, Iowa, May 7.—George D. Rand, brother of Miss Carrie Rand, denied last evening that he and Dr. L. Herron are married. "I don't know anything about it, and I would if the report said to be circulated from Chicago to that effect is true. They are not married. You can say that if they are, I don't know it, and I would know it if they were."

Grinnell, Iowa, May 7.—The dispatch from New York to the effect that Professor Herron will make no defense at the coming church trial causes no surprise in Grinnell, said one of the members of the committee appointed to call the church. "I have had no idea at any time that Herron would defend. There is only one defense that he can make, and that is repentance. If he will publicly repeat and renounce his wife, the church will take him back into fellowship. Otherwise the result of the trial may be forecasted with safety."

NOT VISIBLE HERE

New Comet Can Be Seen Only in South America.

Special to The Journal. Northfield, Minn., May 7.—The new comet, which has been so faithfully searched for at Goodspeed observatory, is not visible in the northern hemisphere. The comet has gone around the sun and is now being viewed in South America, where it has been several times seen as a bright object in the western sky. There is no possibility of seeing the comet here unless it should be bright enough to be visible just at sunset, which is extremely improbable.

Albany, N. Y., May 7.—The employees of the United Traction company, which operates the street car lines in Albany, Troy, Cohoes, Waterbury and Rensselaer, went on a strike at 4 o'clock this morning. The car lines in the five cities are completely tied up.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

"THE COFATENO COMPANY."

The undersigned hereby associate for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Minnesota, and hereby adopt and subscribe the following articles of association.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this corporation shall be "The Cofateno Company."

The general nature of its business shall be to manufacture, cotateno, a substitute for coffee, and other cereals, and to sell and dispose of the product of its manufacture. This corporation shall not engage in any other business than an exclusively manufacturing one.

ARTICLE II.

The principal office and place of business of this corporation shall be the City of Minneapolis, Hennepin County, Minnesota.

ARTICLE III.

The amount of capital stock of the corporation shall be one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), which shall be divided into one thousand shares of \$100 each, and shall be paid in at such times and in such amounts and in such manner as the Board of Directors shall determine and require.

ARTICLE IV.

The highest indebtedness or liability to which the corporation shall at any time be subject shall be the amount of twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00).

ARTICLE V.

The names and places of residence of the persons forming this corporation are as follows: F. E. PARSONS, Residence, Minneapolis, Minn. W. D. REA, Residence, Minneapolis, Minn. M. W. HARDEN, Residence, Marshall, Minn. A. C. CHITTENDEN, Residence, Marshall, Minn. J. H. BURCHARD, Residence, Marshall, Minn. F. C. MATHEWS, Residence, Paul, Minn.

ARTICLE VI.

The government of this corporation and the management of its affairs shall be vested in a Board of six Directors, who shall be elected annually from among its stockholders at their annual meeting, which shall be held at the office of the corporation in Minneapolis, on the first Tuesday in September, 1901, and annually thereafter on the first Tuesday in September of each year. If such meeting be not held at such time it may be held later with notice as provided in these articles.

ARTICLE VII.

Each director shall hold his office for one year and until his successor is elected and enters upon the discharge of his duties. F. E. PARSONS, President; F. C. MATHEWS, Vice President; M. W. HARDEN, Treasurer; A. C. CHITTENDEN, Secretary.

ARTICLE VIII.

The officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and General Manager, and such other officers and agents as the Board of Directors may appoint; any two of such officers may be held by one person, and the officers of the corporation shall be elected at the annual meeting of the stockholders, and the officers so elected shall hold their offices for one year, their successors are elected and enter upon the discharge of their duties. The first officers of the corporation shall be: F. E. PARSONS, President; F. C. MATHEWS, Vice President; M. W. HARDEN, Treasurer; A. C. CHITTENDEN, Secretary.

ARTICLE IX.

Any vacancy in the Board of Directors or in any of the offices of the corporation may be filled by appointment by the remaining directors, such appointment shall be subject to the next annual meeting of the stockholders. The majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Special meetings of the stockholders may be called at any time by the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such special meeting shall be given by mail to all stockholders at least two weeks before such meeting. Meetings of the Board of Directors and of the stockholders of the corporation may be held at the office of the corporation in Minneapolis, or elsewhere in the State of Minnesota more convenient for the transaction of business, or may be held upon the written consent of all of the directors or all of the stockholders.
