DR. BURRELL ON SUPRASAPARIANISM How He Worked a Sly Joke on His Brother Ministers in a Paper About a Mythical Theological Book--Big Words Taken Seriously.

The English translation of the work on Suprasaparianism by Professor Dinkhorst of Bonn, which has created such a sensation among thinking men and particularly theologians, is published in London by Longmans at 22 88 net.

DOUBLE HEAD TAX Commissioner Powderly Thinks Immigrants Should Pay \$2 Each. Washington, May 15.--Commissioner Powderly wants the head tax on immigrants coming into this country increased to not less than \$2 at present this tax is \$1. He has recommended to congress that the increase be made, not with a view to imposing hardships upon the newcomers, but really to help them. He said the increase imposes no severe burden upon those seeking homes in this country, and it would insure the accumulation of a fund sufficient to construct suitable and comfortable buildings whenever needed for the comfort and safety of those waiting inspection, as well as for the administration of the law relating to immigration. The tax of \$1 on each immigrant makes up a fund used in administering the immigration laws.
