## IT HAS A "GRINGH"

The Pennsylvania's Compact and Effective Combination.

17,000 MILES OF ROAD INVOLVED

Controls the Trunk Line Situation Except Through New York State.

### New York Sun Special Service

Chicago, May 20.—White stock speculators have been watching and endeavoring to anticipate consolidations of western railroad systems and Wall street has been filled with rumors of all sorts of great combinations of railroads. The Pennsylvania railroad, almost unnoticed, has been developing a combination of vast strength in the middle states.

The Pennsylvania company has quietly concluded the last of a long, tacking over the Hill interests in the Baltimore & Ohio, and now the announcement is made that the Chesapeake & Ohio has gone into the hands of the dominant Keystone state line.

To-day the Pennsylvania company dominates the railroad situation from the northern border of the state from which it takes its name, to the southern border of Virginia. Its territory, 1,000 miles broad and reaching from the Atlantic ocean to the Ohio river there is not an east and west trunk line that is not absolutely controlled by the Pennsylvania. The company is now master of the situation so far as combination of western lines is concerned. Hill is supposed to have the Erie blocked out for his eastern connection. The Vanderbilt have the New York Central for their Atlantic outlet and the Gould lines, must turn toward the Pennsylvania route for through traffic. The Pennsylvania route is the Pennsylvania company now controls 18,000 miles of tracks through the region of the middle states and middle west productive of the greatest railroad tonnage. The aggregate capitalization of all the roads will exceed \$1,500,000,000.

### PETTIGREW FOR N. P.

Hill Said to Have Offered the ex-Senator the Presidency.

The report is wired from Washington that James J. Hill has offered the presidency of the Northern Pacific to ex-Senator Pettigrew of Colorado. It is said that Mr. Hill offered the position to the South Dakota while the latter was still in the senate, and that by the terms of the offer the salary was to be \$50,000 annually. Mr. Pettigrew was in New York, Saturday, and it is said that he had with him a large block of Northern Pacific stock which he placed at the disposition of Messrs. Hill and Anderson. It is said that the elevation of C. S. Mellen to the presidency of the New York Central is a move in Pettigrew's interest.

President C. S. Mellen, of the Northern Pacific, emphatically stated that he is to be made president of the New York Central road he knows nothing whatever about it. At the same time feeling among twin city railway officials is that there is a strong probability that the report is true and that Mr. Mellen will succeed S. R. Callaway.

### WOODMEN STIRRED UP

They Wonder Why They Can't Have a One-Fare Rate, Too.

The action of the Western Passenger association in granting a single fare rate for the Christian church convention has aroused the anger of the Woodmen. The Woodmen have been unable to get the association to give them anything better than a rate of one-fare plus \$2, though their convention will probably be attended by many times as many persons as that of the Christian church. It is believed, however, that the action of the Milwaukee road in fixing a flat one-fare rate will ultimately force the other roads into this line and the one-fare rate will be obtained by the Woodmen in that manner. There will be a spirited contest for the location of the next convention of the order, the principal cities contesting being Grand Rapids and Milwaukee. Denver is also desirous of securing the next meeting.

### THE DIAMOND JO PACKET LINE

The Diamond Jo Packet Line has made the following round-trip rates: St. Louis, \$24; Hannibal, \$22.25; Fort Madison, \$18.50; Burlington, \$18; Muscatine, \$17; Rock Island and Des Moines, \$16.25; Clinton, \$14.75; Savannah, \$14; Dubuque, \$11.75; McGregor, \$8.75; La Crosse, \$6.75. The Northern Pacific offers an excursion after the adjournment of the convention to the Yellowstone park.

### Brought in 1,000 Visitors.

The excursion over the Angus line of the Minneapolis & St. Louis yesterday was a success. Nearly 1,000 people were brought to the city on the two trains run. The crowds spent the greater part of the day in visiting points of interest and a number put in the day at the neighboring lake resorts. Next Sunday the Minneapolis & St. Louis will run its third excursion of the season, this time over the Watertown line.

### New R. R. in Yucatan.

New York, May 20.—The Southeastern Railroad company of Yucatan, which was formed some time ago largely with American capital, for the purpose of constructing a line into the state of Yucatan, Mexico, has just concluded final arrangements with the Mexican government. It is expected that the contract will shortly be placed in the United States for rails, locomotives, cars, etc., which it is estimated will involve an expenditure of some \$600,000. The railroad will be nearly 300 miles long and will open up a country said to be rich in logwood, cedar and other valuable products.

### WISCONSIN MACCABEES
