

SOLDIERS ON THE MARCH

THIRD STARTS FROM MILACA Over 550 Men Afloat—Lake Will Be Reached by Friday Noon. Special to the Journal. Milaca, Minn., June 6.—The special train bearing seven companies of the Third Regiment, N. G. Co. 2nd, arrived here at noon yesterday, meeting companies A and C of Duluth. After unloading, the regiment went into camp opposite the station, and prepared dinner. A commanding company A. Captain R. E. Conroy, commanding, marched out on the Mill Lake road as an advance guard, followed shortly after by the entire command, the first battalion, commanded by Captain Pratt, with company B. Lieutenant Barnes, commanding, leading in advance. The regiment marched about seven miles and went into camp. Rations were issued for one day previous to the march. Company G of Princeton, the latest addition to the regiment, was inspected in the afternoon. Captain Caswell and his men made a splendid showing. Every company is represented by at least forty-five men. The staff and hospital corps are complete, making a total roll of over 550 men. The following is the order of the day: First call, 5 a. m.; reveille, 5:15; assembly, 6:30; stock call, 5:30; mess, 6; fatigue, 6:40; first call for gear, 7:15; roll call, 7:30; adjutant's call, 7:35; first sergeant's call, 7:45; assembly, 8:15; dress parade, 8:30; band concert, 7:35; first call for taffeta, 8:50; tattoo, 9; taps, 9:30.

OLD SOLDIER DROPS DEAD

Incident of the G. A. R. Encampment at Sioux Falls. Special to the Journal. Sioux Falls, S. D., June 6.—The principal feature to-day of the state assembly of the G. A. R., and auxiliary organizations, was the parade this forenoon through the principal business streets. Hundreds of old and young veterans and members of other organizations, in line, and with flying flags and banners, made a very creditable appearance. Two bands and a drum corps furnished music for the march. The afternoon proceedings commenced with a band concert, after which addresses were read by Arthur R. Brown, assistant; Captain Evan E. Young, Co. I, Crawford; Colonel Lee Stever and others. Captain C. H. Van Slyke, an old and prominent resident of Sioux Falls, and a leading member of the G. A. R., dropped dead late last night, after returning from the campfire on the island. As he alighted from his carriage he complained of feeling sick. His wife alighted just in time to prevent him from falling to the ground. He leaves a widow, two children, a daughter. One son resides in Omaha and the other in New York city. The funeral will probably be conducted by the G. A. R.
