GERMAN SYNOD ELECTS OFFICERS
Winona Clergyman Re-elected President-Sprenger's Paper Proves Much Discussion
Special to the Journal.
Winona, Minn., June 20.—The German Lutheran synod, this morning, listened to a paper by Rev. Fred Sprenger of Hika, Wis., on "How and By What Means the Church Can Be Built Up," and the entire meeting was given up to discussion, which followed.

A meeting of the committee in charge of the denominational college at Watertown, Wis., was held last evening, and matters discussed relative to the report to be presented.
At the business session yesterday afternoon the following officers were elected for the next year: President, Rev. Philip van Rohr, Winona; vice president, Rev. J. Bading of Milwaukee; treasurer, Rev. C. Dewald of Oshkosh, Wis.; secretary, M. Eickmann of Menomonie, Wis.; Rev. A. Keibel of Kirksville, Mo., elected chaplain to open each session of the synod with prayer.

The news of the sudden death of Hadar, New York, Rev. Kluge, while on his way to take a train for the synod, was reported and received with sincere regret. It appears that over-exertion in hastening to the train was the cause of the death.
It is expected that a meeting of the ministry to discuss church matters will be held this evening. There will be no regular evening sessions of the synod, that time being reserved for committee meetings and informal gatherings.

St. Peter's German Lutheran.

St. Peter, Minn., June 20.—The annual conference of the synod of the German Lutheran church of Minnesota, held here, in its session here. Rev. C. Gauswitz, of St. Paul, preached the sermon. His theme was, "The Church in the Future." The roll call showed 10 delegates present. The president, in his annual report, showed that eleven pastors and 1,000 members were present during the year. Four churches and two schools were erected. He also reported the house of prayer and the mission at Platte, in a flourishing condition, and that the rights of the home church in the district and supreme courts in favor of the synod.
