OUR RELATIONS WITH BRITAIN

No End of Uneasiness Apparently Caused on the Continent Thereby.

London, July 1.—The Times' Vienna correspondent communicates a letter he received from a "well known personage, whose intimate knowledge of both European and American affairs gives exceptional value to his views."

The writer deals with the alarm on the continent over American commercial rivalry in connection with the relations of the United States and Great Britain especially as those relations are affected by the Nicaragua canal.

The writer asserts that several continental statements recently taken occasion to assure representatives of Americans of their sincere sympathy with the attitude of the United States as exemplified by the vote of the senate demanding absolute and exclusive control of any and all isthmian canals.

FRAUD IS CONFESSED

INSURANCE FRATERNITIES DUPED

Confession of Dr. McGuire, Arrested as an Accomplice of Dr. O'Toole.

Fort Scott, Kan., July 1.—In the district court here today was filed a confession of Dr. McGuire of Juno, Texas, who was arrested as an accomplice of Dr. Thomas O'Toole of this city in a conspiracy to defraud the Woodmen of the World.

O'Toole was reported to have died of smallpox. McGuire confesses that they planned that the doctor should become sick on the road and should send a young man named Cox, whom he hired as a traveling companion, back to San Angelo after McGuire to come and attend him.

McGuire corroborated all this, but says the grave was dug under a large oak tree and in a thick growth of underbrush that while he was filling the grave of O'Toole was through warning that he O'Toole in the scheme, saying he met O'Toole at San Angelo and later reported to the lodges that he was dead.

SAVED TWO CENTS

Why a \$12,000,000 Check Was Dated Ahead.

It was a check for \$12,000,000 drawn Saturday but dated to-day, July 1, to save the 2-cent revenue stamp that would have been required had the check borne a date of one business day earlier.
