MINNESOTA

HASTINGS—Viola Gillitt, the celebrated blind pianist, died at her home in the town of Warren.

ST. CLOUD—The council authorized the city attorney to annul the franchise of the waterworks company for alleged failure to fulfill the conditions of its contract of furnishing filtered water.

LANESBORO—Suit has been brought by the village of Lanesboro against the 158 waterworks extension contractors and the surety on their construction bond, to recover \$4,750 paid them on contract and \$8,000 damages, the amount being rejected.

REDWOOD FALLS—Redwood county farmers are receiving letters from residents of Iowa inquiring into the advisability of stacking straw so that it can be baled and shipped to Iowa.

WINONA—Jacob Herring is in a serious condition as the result of being struck on the head by a ball in a game Sunday.—William Hiltz, aged 70, died at his home in the town of Warren.

CABLE FLASHES

Havana—General Maximo Gomez has decided to accept the offer of a peace treaty of Cuba. He favors Estrada Palma for the office.

Brussels—Mr. Kruger's friends here say he has recognized that there are now 17,000 burgers and 12,000 rebel Afrikaners under arms and well supplied with weapons and ammunition, although provisions are very scarce.

Vienna—A murder resulting from a vendetta of twenty years' duration occurred in a church at Ober-Sunday. A general fight ensued between the respective partisans, with the result that seven persons were killed and twenty-three wounded.

London—General Kitchener telegraphs from Pretoria to the war office as follows: "I am glad to send you the latest return I have yet had for one week. Since Aug. 5, 5 columns report thirty-nine killed, twenty wounded and 685 prisoners, a total of 825. The columns have also captured 24,000 rounds of small-arm ammunition, 254 wagons, 5,580 horses and over 32,000 cattle. Most of the captures were made in the Orange River Colony."

London—The house passed a second reading of the Pacific cable bill, by a vote of 153 to 59. In the debate, James G. Flynn, nationalist, who opposed the bill, made a personal attack on the colonial secretary and upon Lord Strathearn and Mount Royal. J. A. Austin Chamberlain, who followed, declined to notice the attack upon his father, but said he thought it a cruel thing to cast reflections upon Lord Strathearn and Mount Royal because the latter had been selected by hands to sit on the cable board.
