## A SIGN OF WEALTH

Farmers Stacking Their Wheat, Not Threshing From Shock.

### GOOD THING FOR THE RAILROADS

It Means the Crop Will Be Handled More Easily—No Danger of Car Famine.

Traffic men have advised that the farmers of the northwest will stack their wheat to a greater extent than in years past and thresh from the shock less. This means, they believe, that the early movement of wheat will not be so great, making the transportation problem easier than in other years when the northwest has been favored with a reasonably large crop of wheat.

It is the experience of railroad men that a community grows more prosperous and independent its farmers do less of the early hurrying of wheat to market that characterizes the newer countries. Minnesota wheat raisers for the past few years have been about getting their wheat to market in a leisurely way. Some of the northwestern roads for several years have had their first large receipts from North Dakota. But it is expected that North Dakota will not be early threshing than usual this year.

The collector heretofore has been one of the most urgent factors in the early threshing habit since the northwest began to be largely populated. He has waited his money early and the farmer, to accommodate him, has put the thrasher to work and sent the grain to market at the earliest possible moment.

Most of the roads have new equipment ordered, which will be delivered in September and October, to aid in handling the crop. All of the roads have been "nursing" their cars back into this territory for several weeks past. General Freight Agent Martin of the Soo, looks for a lively business this fall, but does not think danger of a car famine is worth considering.

Several of the roads during the past few weeks have brought considerable old wheat to Minneapolis. Many of the farmers now that a good crop is in sight, are shipping the old wheat, which they have had on hand. The numerous shipments show the frugality of the northwestern farmer. He holds to enough old wheat to furnish bread and seed until he sees the new crop assured.

### MAY COMBINE

#### Three Big Passenger Associations May Consolidate.

Passenger men are interested in the report that the Southwestern, the Western and the Transcontinental Passenger associations are to be consolidated. The reason given is that through the financial rearrangement of the owners of the lines composing these associations the existence of so many bodies involves an unnecessary expense. The higher traffic officials are said to favor the plan.

### Shipments of Flour.

Shipments of flour for the last week were 73,000 barrels, a gain of 2,000 barrels over last year. Shipments of wheat were 2,800 bushels, a loss of 18,000 bushels from the previous week, and 32,000 bushels from last year. Shipments of provisions were 29,127 tons, showing a loss of 631 tons from the previous week, and a gain of 3,355 tons over last year.

Western roads are having a good traffic, not only in grain, which is about up to normal, but also in merchandise. The grain traffic in the northwest is not quite so large, but the roads in that section are having all the business they can handle.

### Looking for Big Gains.

A Great Northern man on the inside is quoted as saying: "The chances are that the Great Northern will get a very large share of the five-fifths of the entire spring wheat crop this year and the Northern Pacific will gain very little. The Great Northern has the managers of these roads if their aggregate gain in gross earnings reached \$10,000,000 for the year, of which the Great Northern would be net. The northwest will be extraordinarily prosperous this fall and winter."

### Excursion to New Uim.

The Minneapolis & St. Louis will run an excursion from various points near New Uim to that town next Sunday. The excursion traffic of the Minneapolis & St. Louis has been decidedly satisfactory this year, and although the season is about closed, the road may run another big business excursion from Iowa and southern Minnesota points later in the fall. On its excursion last Sunday the Minneapolis & St. Louis brought 2,000 people to Minneapolis.

### Railroad Notes.

For the national gathering of Knights Templar at Indianapolis, Minnesota knights have named the Wisconsin Central the official route to Chicago. The Wisconsin Central will furnish a special train.

The application of the Great Northern road for membership in the interchangeable mileage bureau has not been acted upon by the Western Passenger Association. It is understood that the Western Association will require General Passenger Agent Whitney to appear before the association before it does act.

The North-Western road has decided upon a very large rate for northwestern Nebraska points to the twin cities. The passenger department expects an unusually heavy business.

Officials of the Burlington road have reports from all divisions of their lines in Nebraska, showing crop rains throughout the state Sunday. The Burlington road is expected that the road will be turned over to the operating department within a month.

The Canadian Pacific railway has declared a regular semi-annual dividend of 2 per cent on its preferred stock and 2 1/2 per cent on its common stock.

A rearrangement of time and mileage schedules and changes in the agreements with their roads are the objects of a meeting of the executive board of Northern Pacific and Great Northern freight lines. The committee expects to complete its work quickly with the return of the officials from the coast.

### CONSTITUTION INTERPRETED

#### Professor Sparks Says It Does Not Grant Equal Social Rights.

Special to The Journal. Chicago, Aug. 14.—That the constitution of the United States does not promise equal rights to all citizens in all respects was one of the statements with which Professor Edwin B. Sparks of the University of Chicago addressed the students of his class in American history. Professor Sparks asserted that the American revolution differed from the French in that it was political only, while the French was chiefly social. This difference, he said, made the framers of the constitution adopt a subtle language, which is generally misunderstood, but which really means that the constitution grants equal political rights but not equal social rights. To grant equal rights, he asserts, would make the government paternal.

### IMPROVING NAVY YARD

#### New Structures at Brooklyn Costing Two Millions.

New York, Aug. 14.—Improvements at the Brooklyn navy yard to cost about \$2,000,000 will soon be commenced by the yards and dock department. Within the next few weeks the department will advertise through the authorities at Washington for bids on the construction of four new structures to cost in the neighborhood of \$1,000,000. These buildings, with the erection of a great cooling pier from the Cob dock, a number of buildings for the ordnance dock and the completion of work already under way, will call for an expenditure of about \$2,000,000.

### HOW McLAURIN STANDS

Says a Man Can Be Progressive Without Being Republican.

Norfolk, Va., Aug. 14.—Senator McLaurin of South Carolina, passed through Norfolk on his way to the Pan-American exposition. He made the following statement: "For many years the campaigns in South Carolina have been in the nature of personal abuse of candidates. The present campaign is the first one in which an issue is at stake. My series of speeches, which were begun last April, have started the people to think, and they have become aroused. Senator Tillman has met my arguments by heaping abuse upon me. He threatened to go out among the mill owners and arouse them against the mill owners if I continued urging the expansion policy and the carrying of American products in American bottoms. Expansion is not imperialism; the first a business question, the other a matter of politics. It is foolishness for anybody to claim that a man cannot believe in ship subsidies, the carrying of American exports in American bottoms, and expansion, without being a republican. I am going into the primaries in South Carolina next fall, and I expect to defeat Senator Tillman."

### DEAD COMMANDER

Washington, Aug. 14.—The navy department has received a cablegram announcing the death at the Yokohama hospital of Commander Frederick M. Wise. He died of heart disease and had only been sick a few days. ## ATTACK BY FRIARS

Circular Calling the Philippine Commission Names.

Manila, Aug. 14.—The friars have issued a circular to the public through which they anathematize the government in the disguise of an appeal to Catholics. The circular declares that Governor Taft has declared war against God, and denounces the members of the Philippine commission as four rickety brayers. The occasion for this is said to be that in a recent local dispute in Tarlac City Governor Taft issued a proclamation to the effect that he neither desired to nor could he interfere in religious questions, and reminding the persons involved of the separation of church and state.

The pamphlet calls the government officials buffoons, talkative politicians, persecutors, pusillanimous politicians who are seeking to overthrow the church under the guise of a pernicious liberty and are trying to eclipse the sun of the moral world. It calls on Catholics morally to unite against "the infamous and irreligious government."
