How the Police Compel Criminals Like Czolgosz to Talk. HORRIBLE TORTURES ARE USED. Prisoners Made to Suffer Excruciating Pain Until They Find Their Tongues.

The administration to Czolgosz of the so-called "third" or "thirty-third degree" by the Buffalo police to elicit information concerning the investigation of the crime and his accomplices regarded by Minneapolis police officers and detectives as a legitimate procedure and the only effective method that can be used in dealing with such a case.

While admitting that very drastic measures are adopted in the "sweat box" in order to extract a confession from suspects, the police officials seldom divulge the nature of the process employed. There is no set method in use. Each prisoner, when taken into the "sweat box," is given different treatment, depending entirely on his temperament and mental condition and the nature of the crime.
