Stocks Take a Spurt After a Listless Opening. PRICES UP, SHORTS BUYING WELL Market Shows More Breadth, the Coolers Being Notably Strong.

New York, Oct. 10.—Trading was listless at the opening and reflected no well-defined special sentiment. Nearly all of the most prominent stocks opened unchanged.

Trading became active and prices rose 10 3/4 with the short interest large buyers. Stocks which had recently been liquidated, particularly Sugar, American and Brooklyn Transit, made the largest advances.

Once more reaction in prices was followed by almost stagnant conditions and strength was again in the market and prices generally advanced to the highest level of the day.
