HEALTH OF TROOPS AMERICAN PARALLEL

Encouraging Report of Surgeon General Sternberg.

LESS EVIL FROM ALCOHOLISM. Health of the Soldiers in the Philippines Shows Steady Improvement.

Washington, Oct. 11.—Surgeon General Sternberg has made his annual report to the secretary of war. He says: The health of the army was unusually good during the calendar year 1900.

In the Philippine Islands, with a mean strength of 62,332, the admission rate was 2621.96, as compared with 2355.52 in the previous year, this increase being mainly due to disease among the volunteers.

The steady decrease of late years in the admissions for alcoholism among the men of the regular army is a matter for congratulation.

TORN BY FIERCE STORMS

SECTIONS OF WESTERN IOWA. Roundhouse and Light Plant at Shenandoah Wrecked—Much Track Washed Out.

Shenandoah, Iowa, Oct. 11.—The worst wind and rain storm that ever visited this place struck the city at 4:30 yesterday afternoon.

Omaha, Neb., Oct. 11.—A severe wind and rain storm which struck western Iowa at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon and did much damage to telegraph wires and washed out railroad tracks.

At Villisca several buildings were damaged. At Shenandoah the deluge of rain caused the Nishnabotna river to spread over two miles of bottoms and cover the railroad tracks and wash out the ungalvanized pipes.

SEE THEIR CROPS SPOIL

DEPLORABLE SITUATION IN N. DAK. Rain Again Falling Over a Large Area—Laborers Leaving the State.

Special to The Journal. Larimore, N. D., Oct. 11.—Rain began falling in the eastern and entire northern portion of the state at midnight Sunday, since which no threshing has been done.

The situation of the wheat and fax crop is growing very serious. Great apprehension is now felt that the crop cannot be saved. Threshing is not half done and in some parts of the state there is still fax to cut.

Minnewaukan, N. D., Oct. 11.—Continued light rains delay threshing. For the past forty days only twenty days of work has been done. There was a small cloudburst northeast of Missouri Valley which took out several county bridges.
