FAVORED FOR BASS AND TROUT Game Warden Fullerton Says Present Open Season Overlaps the Spawning.

The closed season for black bass and trout should be lengthened at least fifteen days, in the opinion of Sam Fullerton, state game warden.

The black bass season ends March 1 and begins again June 1. The bass are supposed to spawn during May and June, but in colder water they often spawn as late as June 15.

The open season for trout begins May 1 and closes Sept. 1. This permits trout fishing during August. It is the same with trout as with bass, in warm water they spawn earlier.
