A GRAND JUROR INDICTED

P. E. SKAHEN IS ARRAIGNED

There Are Four Indictments Charging Extortion and Attempted Extortion.

P. Edward Skahen, a member of the grand jury, was arraigned before Judge Elliott yesterday on four indictments returned by his colleagues. He is charged with extortion of \$14,450 from Frank N. Davis and attempting to extort \$60 more. The state of affairs is peculiar. According to the indictments, Skahen secured the money, or attempted to secure it, by threatening to accuse Davis of forgery in the second degree. The alleged forgery consisted of notes purporting to have been signed by G. I. Haines and by several other persons. Skahen pleaded not guilty and his bail was fixed at \$2,500. The trial was set for Dec. 4.

A BAD BLAZE AT ST. PAUL

Damage to Machinery, Goods and Raw Supplies Will Amount to \$70,000.

There was a destructive fire to-day in the plant of the American Grass Twine company, Front and Mackubin streets, St. Paul. Property valued at \$70,000 was destroyed.

The fire was confined to an immense warehouse, containing two small departments of the factory and an enormous quantity of manufactured articles. That were there also about 35,000 pounds of warp in the storage building valued at 40 cents per pound. The machinery was worth at least \$40,000.

TEXAS OIL NEWS.

A Game of Hide and Seek Among Oil Producers. All Striving for the Advantage in Selling Oil.
