#### TAMMANY AND BASEBALL

American League Now Expects to Break into New York.

New York Sun Special Service. Chicago, Nov. 7.—Despite the guarded statements of President Johnson of the American League it can be regarded as a certainty that the American League will try its wires at once for entrance into New York. The change of base came with the team in New York yesterday swept from power and with it Andrew Freedman, dictator in baseball on Manhattan Island.

The plans of the American League include the control of the polo grounds, Freedman's own. Should the league be able to secure this it can be regarded as a certainty that the American League will have a team in New York next season.

Injury May Force His Retirement From the Track.

Chicago, Nov. 7.—Robert Waddell, winner of the last American derby, and one of the most popular 3-year-olds the turf has known, broke down badly in the fourth race at Lakeside yesterday afternoon and may never face the flag again. The only other starters in the race at 1 1/2 miles were Searcher and Frangible, the former alternating with Waddell in the lead for the first six furlongs, when the latter halted in his tracks, and Searcher won by eight lengths from Frangible. The nature and extent of the injuries to Robert Waddell have not been determined fully, as it is believed they may be so serious as to terminate his career. The accident was the feature of the day and seemed to detract from the interest in the rest of the program.

### ELLSWORTH'S NEW "PREXY"

Prof. J. E. Conner Elected to Vacancy in Iowa Falls School.

Special to The Journal. Iowa Falls, Iowa, Nov. 7.—It was announced this morning that Professor J. E. Conner of the state university would be the next president of Ellsworth college. He will be here this week and on his return next Monday, Mr. Conner is a young man and eminently qualified for the position. He is a graduate of the state university and later took a post-graduate course at Yale and studied along special lines for two years at the University of Chicago.

### WANDERED FOR A YEAR

HOLCOMB'S LIFE WAS A BLANK

Daniel S. Holcomb, Stock Dealer of Baraboo, Wis., Restored to His Family.

Baraboo, Wis., Nov. 7.—Daniel S. Holcomb, a well-known stock dealer, who mysteriously disappeared from this city about a year ago, was turned up at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Leaven Pease in Chicago. On Nov. 14 of last year Mr. Holcomb left Baraboo and started for Delton to fill an appointment with a farmer from whom he expected to purchase some stock. The place decided upon for the meeting was at the summer home of H. S. Kerfoot. Upon Mr. Holcomb's arrival at the Kerfoot farm the man had not put in his appearance, so Mr. Holcomb borrowed some fishing tackle and went to the Wisconsin river, a few rods away, to pass the time in fishing, his favorite sport. As nothing was seen of him for several hours, a search was made, but no trace could be found, except his fishing rod and a few footprints along the river bank. It was supposed he accidentally fell into the river and was drowned, and a reward was offered for the recovery of his body. Although the river was dragged for several days no body was found.

William J. Bell, a local detective, took up the case, and on the opposite side of the river he found footprints that tallied with Holcomb's. From there he traced him to a block station on the Milwaukee railway. Here the station agent identified Holcomb by means of a photograph and also gave a full description of him. From the station the trace was lost and nothing more was heard from him until he appeared at the home of his daughter a few weeks ago.

Mr. Holcomb had roamed the country for about a year and can give no account of himself, and says he remembers nothing from the time he left Baraboo until he arrived in Chicago. Upon his arrival there his wife was notified and she has been with him ever since. They will return to their home in Baraboo in a few days.

#### FIRE TEN SHOTS

Gambler's Fight a Duel With Fatal Results to Both.

Marion, Ill., Nov. 7.—Mann Holman and Junior Meredith fought with revolvers in the principal street of the city this morning. Holman is lying with a bullet over his heart, and Meredith is not expected to live. Both men were gamblers. The trouble is said to have started over a game of cards. Ten shots were fired, four of them taking effect.

The Japanese government has adopted a new plan to provide capital for the extension of the railroads and telegraphs, which are now yielding a profit of 7 per cent. It is the plan to sell 7,000,000 yen to the postal savings bank, appropriating the sum to the railroads.
