Clearings for 1901 Will Probably Reach \$625,000,000 BEATING 1900 BY \$45,000,000

All of the Larger Banks Report a Splendid Increase in Deposits. Minneapolis bank clearings for the year 1901, it is estimated, will reach \$625,000,000, as against \$579,994,000 for 1900.

The Northwestern National has 60 per cent more deposits to-day than it had a year ago; and the volume of its business has about doubled. The First National also reports twice the business it did last year, although this may be accounted for, to some extent, by the fact that it has absorbed the old Nicollet National bank.
