Iowa State Fair Grounds Underlaid With Black Diamonds.

SOCIETY WANTS POWER TO SELL

Secretary Van Houten Urges It, Also a First-Class Exhibit at St. Louis.

Special to The Journal. Des Moines, Iowa, Dec. 11.—Secretary G. H. Van Houten, in his annual report to the state department of agriculture, made this morning at the state agricultural convention, recommended that the legislature grant the right to the department to sell the coal under the state fair grounds.

Much space is given in the report to the Louisiana Purchase exposition at St. Louis and the part Iowa should take in it. This is a subject of special interest now, the legislature will soon pass on the question of an appropriation.

The report takes up in detail the subject of crops and yields for the past year. Van Houten holds that of the really merchantable corn produced in Iowa this year there was less than half a crop.

Mr. Van Houten estimates that the crop of the present year has a greater value, as prices now run, than the crops of last year.

Mr. Van Houten makes the striking announcement that Angola goat meat is being largely used under the guise of mutton.

At the meeting of the Iowa State Farmers' Institute, preceding the agricultural convention, a committee was named, headed by Henry Wallace of Des Moines to bring before the legislature a bill for increased aid to farmers' institutes in the counties and state supervision as provided in the Illinois law.

HE PRAISES COAST PINE

HUGHES JOLLIES WESTERNERS

And Predicts Another Year of Prosperity for Millmen and Loggers.

Special to The Journal. Tacoma, Wash., Dec. 11.—"We must come west for lumber."

The sentence was uttered by J. A. Hughes, a well known lumberman of Minneapolis, who is in Tacoma. For several years Mr. Hughes has been associated with a firm that is handling Washington lumber, and recently a new firm was organized and connections established that will result in larger shipments than ever being sent to Minnesota from this state.

It is the beginning of the end so far as the timber of Minnesota is concerned. The cut at Minneapolis this year will be as large as ever—about 500,000,000 feet. There will be little left for the mills to cut after the close of this season.

There is only one source of timber, and that is made from the Washington red cedar. Of course there are still a few white cedar shingles manufactured in Michigan and Wisconsin, but they are all used in the locality in which they are cut and none is left to supply the demand in the cities of the middle west.

I look for a good lumber trade next year. It is certain the demand for the first six months of the year will be greater than ever, and I see no reason why it should not be good throughout the year.


