Iron Ore Shipments of the Year Compared With 1900.

Duluth, Minn., Dec. 11.—Iron ore shipments from Minnesota mines this year and last have been as follows:

The total for the Mesaba range is 9,001,769 gross tons, against 7,809,525 last year, and that for the Vermillion range is 1,789,857.

The railroad shipped as follows: Duluth & Iron Range, 5,028,765 gross tons; Duluth, Missabe & Northern, 3,487,955 tons; Eastern Minnesota, 2,321,000 tons; total, 10,787,720.
