FRATERNAL INSURANCE

Opposition in Iowa to a Legislative Table of Rates.

Des Moines, Iowa, Dec. 13.—At a meeting of the legislative committee appointed at the session of the Iowa Fraternal Congress here this week, the question of legislation for this winter was considered. C. E. Stallop of Sac City is head of the committee. H. A. Miller of Sioux City is secretary. The committee has not determined thus far to introduce any bills in the legislature. Its main duty will be to look after all bills that may be introduced affecting fraternal beneficiary societies.
In outlining the work of the committee, Mr. Stallop said he believed that practically every fraternal insurance man in Iowa was opposed to a legislative table of

rates and that if the National Fraternal Congress should have a bill introduced prescribing a minimum rate, it would be fought by the committee.

ARM CAUGHT IN MANGLER

Laundry Employee at Grafton Seriously Injured.

Grafton, N. D., Dec. 13.—Miss Lizzie Givens had her arm broken in three places. She is an employee of the Model Steam Laundry, and while running the mangle her hand was caught and before the machinery could be stopped her arm was drawn in as far as the elbow. It is thought it can be saved.
