


PROBABLY JERRY KELLY

Realty in Minneapolis

Edmund G. Walton gives the following on the ratio of rent to assessed valuation: The relation of income to real value is a very interesting subject, one that makes men and owners of property, and as the assessed valuation is so graduated as to equalize the weight of taxation, it may be interesting to many to study the relation per square foot of value as fixed by the assessor and the income as fixed by the landlord.

Take the store, No. 524 Nicollet, which has a rental value of \$200 a year, being 2388 feet, its rental value a square foot is \$1.54 as against an assessed value of \$7.57. The store, No. 407 Nicollet, occupied by C. D. White, only 2200 feet, rents for \$2,400 a year, or \$1.09 a square foot, while No. 224 Nicollet, which is a square foot of \$2,000, which is \$1.21 a square foot income as against \$5.06 a square foot assessed value.

Comparison in this way should act wonderfully in keeping purchasers from making mistakes when investing; inasmuch as my figures plainly show that, although No. 246 Nicollet is less valuable than No. 246 Nicollet, it actually rents for much more—the real percentage in its favor being as 875 to 418.

However you figure and however you twist around it is plainly shown that for low taxation and large income, you want to have your store on Nicollet and Nicollet avenue. It may be that rents are wrongly adjusted, I myself think rents far too low and am making every effort to double up on them, but I take time and good judgment. However, it will come.

Building Notes.

The Improvement Bulletin reports for the week as follows: Leck & Prince have been awarded the general contract by Edmund G. Walton, manager Realty Care & Improvement Co., to remodel and build a brick addition running parallel to 43rd street and Nicollet avenue, 43rd street S. The entire front will be removed and replaced with white enameled terra cotta, leading and glass mahogany finish, ornamental plaster ceiling, tile and marble floors. Mark J. Fitzpatrick, architect. Cost, \$100,000.

Charles R. Aldrich, architect, has plans for a residence in the north side of St. Anthony for Mrs. Edw. H. Hill. It will be about 32x20, two stories, attic and basement, frame, old colonial style. Cost, \$45,000.



The Twin City Telephone company took out the largest electric permit issued from the building inspector's office this year. It calls for the installation of switchboards in the central exchange, at \$90,000; the South Side, \$25,000, and the East Side, at \$15,000; total, \$130,000.

NOVELTY TO THEM

Wrecked Sailors Do Not Understand Life-Saving Apparatus. London, Dec. 14.—Although abating over the channel, the storm on the east coast of Great Britain continues fierce. The British bark Wave Queen sank this morning off West Hartlepool. Seven of her crew were drowned. The Spanish steamer Alansuela, from Hamburg, with twenty hands on board, went ashore near Sunderland. The rocket brigade twice got a line on board the steamer, but the crew were apparently unable to understand the apparatus. Many minor wrecks, involving loss of life, have been reported.
