

SQUAW WITH A GUN

She Stopped Track Laying on Mr. Hill's Republic Road. THE COURTS HAD TO INTERFERE. Right of Way Allowance Was Not Satisfactory to a Colville Indian.

Special to The Journal. Spokane, Wash., Dec. 24.—Angelina Stewart, squaw, for twenty-four hours successfully defied the power of the Great Northern Railroad company. In daring and reckless Angelina beats Governor Van Sant of Minnesota all to pieces as a railroad fighter. Governor Van Sant has talked about the power of such trivial bodies as courts and legislators in resisting the machinations of "Jim" Hill. Angelina, disdaining such puny weapons, armed herself with a shotgun.

Angelina owns a ranch in the Colville reservation, over which the Washington & Great Northern, Mr. Hill's Republic Road, desires to build a line. The ranch is in Stevens county. Angelina's damages for giving the road a right of way were duly assessed by a commissioner appointed by the secretary of the interior.

Friday night Squaw Angelina and her husband built a new house directly over the right of way of the railway. In fact, it looks like a case of indefinite siege and defense. From the emissary of the hostile army, to the railroad company, Angelina demanded \$500 in coin of the realm before she would permit the construction of the road. The damages assessed in her favor by the white father's agent were less than that and the emissary tried to reason with her and demanded that she cease disturbing the workmen.

SAID OF SUGAR. President Post Explains the Recent Cut in Prices. New York, Dec. 24.—James H. Post, president of the National Sugar Refining company, in an interview regarding the sugar situation and the recent cut in prices, said: At this time of the year the grocers do not buy very largely of sugar. They all seem very badly demoralized by the recent rapid declines. It seems to have been their policy for some time past. The small decline in raw sugar has been caused by the possible withdrawal of a portion of the bonus by European countries. In addition there are the excessive stocks all over the world of both beet and cane sugars.
