**Berlin**—The German charge d'affaires at Caracas, Herr von Pilgrim-Bittard, has handed President Castro a note, in which the German claims against Venezuela are clearly defined, and in which a limit of time is set for President Castro's answer thereto.

**Byzantium**—Several hundred half-starved Turkish troops mutinied and demanded their arrears of pay. They attacked the governor of the province and the commandant of the garrison and looted them. The mutineers also repulsed the cavalry sent to rescue the officials.

## WOULDN'T SELL TO BELL CO.

**NEW YORK SUN SPECIAL SERVICE**  
Toledo, Ohio, Jan. 4.—Refusal of the heads of the Everett-Moore syndicate to yield to the demands of the American Bell Telephone company is said to be responsible for the difficulty in which the syndicate has found itself. This statement is made in support of the striking man whose close connection with syndicate affairs places him in a position to know.

When the syndicate first entered the telephone field it was with a view to building up an immense system which should be wholly independent of the Bell control. Contracts for line distance service were made with the distinct understanding that the syndicate was never to sell out to the opposition and a number of cities franchises were granted almost wholly upon this basis.

The American Bell company made a proposition, amounting almost to a demand, a short time ago, that the federal company sell out its interests. It is stated that the Bell people offered to permit the syndicate to retain nominally the ownership of the telephone properties; the Bell company to take up the underlying securities of the federal company at a profitable figure besides giving the heads of the syndicate \$1,000,000 for withdrawing from the hold. With a determination to sell out to the opposition and a number of cities franchises were granted almost wholly upon this basis.

## FIRES IN THE NORTHWEST

**LOSSES OF THREE MORRIS FIRMS**  
\$35,000 Dry Goods Stock of Charles L. Gray of Owatonna Reduced to Ashes.

Morris, Minn., Jan. 4.—The Spooner block was destroyed by fire yesterday, and the following were the losses: Rib Johnson's land office, Estaque & Co., and C. A. Hall.

The fire is supposed to have started in the Knights of Pythias hall, on the second floor. The lodge had been doing work, and installing new officers. The total loss is estimated at \$35,000, only partly covered by insurance.

## WOMEN NO PHYSICIANS

**TRUSTEE'S WORDS CAUSE A ROW**  
Buildings and Grounds of Chicago Women's College of Medicine to Be Sold.

Chicago, Jan. 4.—The business agent of Northwestern university is negotiating for the sale of the buildings and grounds of the women's college of medicine, with a view to abandoning that institution. Trustee James H. Raymond said of the abandonment of the college:

It is impossible to make a doctor of a woman. Woman cannot grasp the chemical and pharmaceutical laboratory work, the intricate details of surgery, the minute work of dissecting. At our women's medical department we do not get as high a class of scholarship as we do at the other colleges in Northwestern university.

Dr. Frances Dickinson, Dr. Julia Holmes Smith, Dr. Sarah Hackett Stevenson and others were astonished at the attitude of Trustee Raymond, and expressed themselves in vigorous terms. Dr. Smith said:

**The Findings of Judge Quinn Are Against the Road.**

## LARGEST YACHT

**Emperor William's, Which Miss Roosevelt Will Charter.**  
New York, Jan. 4.—The German emperor's yacht, which Miss Alice Roosevelt will charter, is the largest yacht ever built. It is being built by the Townsend & Downey Shipbuilding company, from designs by Cary Smith and Barby. She will be the largest schooner yacht afloat, her dimensions being 161 feet over all, with a beam of twenty-seven feet. All her deck work, such as the deckhouse, skylights and rail, will be of selected teakwood, and all capstans winches, etc., of bronze.

## JUMPS FROM A TRESTLE

**Woman Killed While Escaping an Approaching Train.**  
Cincinnati, Jan. 4.—Miss Anna Clark, a domestic, died to-day as a result of a frightful jump from a trestle fifty feet in a frenzied effort to escape death from an approaching train. She was crossing the Duck creek trestle on the Cincinnati, Portsmouth & Virginia road, when a rapidly moving train came upon her. It was impossible for her to reach the end of the trestle, and she leaped just before the train reached her. She was alive when picked up, but later died at the hospital.


