MEET TO TALK OF NEW RATES

Railroad Men Consider Revised Northern Schedules

NO BIG AREA AFFECTED Reductions to the Southwest Will Cut Little Figure.

LUMBER RATES NOT TOUCHED Western Lumbermen Were Hopeful, but a Reduction Would Have Helped Them.

Representatives of many of the northwestern roads are conferring to-day in the general offices of the Great Northern over the rate reductions proposed by the lines represented.

It develops that the territory affected by the reductions is not as large as supposed when the first announcement was made. The Great Northern has lines into the southwest, some of which were built to retaliate on the Milwaukee and Northern for encroachments on the territory of north coast lines.

ARGUMENTS IN THE MERGER CASE JAN. 27

Supreme Court Fixes Date and Directs That Notice of Application Be Given Securities Co.

This Is a Departure From the Practice of the Court and Is Looked Upon as an Ominous Sign.

From The Journal Bureau, Room 45, Post-Office Building, Washington, Jan. 13.—The supreme court to-day took a most surprising course in the merger case. After a number of decisions had been announced by associate justices and by Chief Justice Fuller, the latter announced: "State of Minnesota vs. Northern Securities company. Notice of application for leave to file bill of complaint is directed to be given (to Northern Securities company) and the application will be heard on Monday, Jan. 27."

Attorney General Douglas would not criticize the court's action and would only say: "The court's action is in opposition to the rule laid down in the case of Georgia vs. Wallace, in which it was held that no notice of intention to file such an application was necessary except when the president of the United States is a party. I will, of course, follow the court's direction and will serve notice on the Northern Securities company through the United States marshal for New Jersey."

On the other hand, suggestions were made by the court officers that the judges had decided to hear arguments on the application because of the importance of the case. It is said that these will be directed solely to the question of jurisdiction and not to the merits of the case in any way.
