MR. CUMMINS' FIRST. New Governor of Iowa Discusses the Leading Issues. HOW TO DEAL WITH COMBINES. Competition vs. Publicity Discussed. Tariff Reduction and Railway Taxation.

Special to The Journal. Des Moines, Iowa, Jan. 16.—In his inaugural address at the capitol to-day, Governor Cummins said: Senators, Representatives and Fellow-Citizens: I gratefully acknowledge my deep appreciation of the confidence and good will of my fellow men, and I am solemnly conscious of the obligations I have undertaken and the responsibilities I have assumed.

Industrial Combines. The rapid accumulation of wealth and its unparallelled concentration were the distinguishing characteristics of the last decade of the nineteenth century. These characteristics have propounded a new inquiry for governmental investigation. The subject has, by common consent, received a name which, though once appropriate, is now altogether misleading. Commercial combinations and industrial trusts have provoked much thought which, as yet, has produced little result.

Publicity Not a Cure. I am unable to agree that we can cure whatever evils may exist in these organizations by publicity. The public are already sufficiently public so that every intelligent man understands in a general way what they are composed of, what they are doing and what they are accomplishing. It would require them to make statements, and to submit to examinations; but if we are to limit our regulation to mere publicity, the outcome will not justify the attention we are bestowing upon the subject.

Labor and Capital. The government, as it seems to me, has at least one duty to perform in this connection. It is to establish a standard of living for the men who can never rise to that prominence which will enable them to fully protect themselves, shall receive that reward for their labor, and shall be surrounded by such conditions, as will make them good citizens. I believe that the power which wealth bestows ought sometimes to be checked, and, through wise legislation, the rights of the weak and helpless more carefully preserved.

Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Jan. 16.—At its meeting last night the city council granted certain concessions to the Chicago & North-Western Railway company which will cause the erection during the present year of new freight offices and freight houses, two blocks in length and forty feet in width.
