NEED OF MORE POWER

Street Railway Company Considering Plans to Meet It.

The problem of how best to secure additional power for the running of its cars is one that has caused the Twin City Rapid Transit company considerable trouble during the past few months. The company realizes that the power generated by the Tenth avenue dam is not, at all times, sufficient, and hence has been casting about for a way out of the difficulty.

At present three plans are under consideration. One calls for the erection of another dam across the Mississippi, near Coon creek, and the establishment of a power house at that point. A second contemplates the erection of storage plants about the city; and the third requires the abandonment of those plants which were abandoned following the construction of the present dam.

Weather Conditions.

The storm central yesterday in Tennessee has moved northeastward to about the Hudson river valley, with increasing severity as it approaches the ocean, causing heavy rains along the north Atlantic coast, and snow in western New York and Pennsylvania. Easterly gales have prevailed on the north Atlantic coast, the highest wind velocity reported being 60 miles per hour at New York. Rain has fallen in California during the past 24 hours, and light snow in western South Dakota and Montana. It is warmer than yesterday morning in the Dakotas, and decidedly colder from northern Montana northward. The lowest temperatures reported this morning are 4 degrees below at Havre and Calgary and 8 degrees below at Medicine Hat and Edmonton.
