

NORMAN DANES FROM VIKINGS LAND

Over 1,000,000 Persons of Scandinavian Birth in the U. S.

SWEDES ARE MOST NUMEROUS Almost Outnumber Norwegians and Danes Combined—Census by States.

According to recent census statistics collected by Scandinavian there are in the United States 1,067,687 persons of Scandinavian birth. These with their children born in this country number 2,311,106—quite an army of bread winners.

Of those born in Scandinavia there are 574,826 from Sweden, 338,428 from Norway and 164,616 from Denmark.

The Swedes outnumber their brethren in every state in the union except Wisconsin, South Dakota, North Dakota and Hawaii.
