A LIBERAL PARTY A Convention at Stockholm Decides to Organize One.

ANOMALOUS STATE IN RIKSDAG The Liberal Elements There Have Never Presented an Organized Front.

Sweden is finally to have a liberal party. At a convention recently held at Stockholm, at which all parts of the country were represented, it was decided to organize a liberal party.

Naturally there have been many riksdag members with very liberal, not to say radical, views, but there has been no party organization and it is generally recognized as such.

The plan of organization is patterned after that of the liberal party in Great Britain and there will be a national committee with branches in every large district.

That the new party will be heartily supported and will wield a great influence from the start, there is no doubt.

Those "SAW FILERS" The London Daily Chronicle Satisfied They Are Spies.

Sweden and Norway have long since been alarmed over the big fort on the island of Hango, which is believed to be a military spy.

Now England is becoming alarmed also. The Daily Chronicle is quite satisfied that the saw filers are spies and states a positive belief in the opinion that Russia is planning an attack on Sweden and Norway.

If there is any doubt of Russian aggression the construction of a big fort on the Swedish border and twenty-eight barracks along the Norwegian boundary ought to convince the most skeptical, as Russia has little to fear from the Scandinavian republics.

There is danger, grave danger, to England, says the paper, for not only has it guaranteed the integrity of the Scandinavian countries, but it has not afforded to have the ambitious Russian giant at its back.

Where is Sverdrup? Hopes of Promoters of Arctic Research Seem to Be Dashed.

A few months ago the Norwegian promoters of Arctic research expressed their firm belief that Captain Sverdrup and his vessel the Fram had traced the coast of north end of Greenland and were now somewhere on the east coast of the great island, says the New York Sun.

Their faith in this support has now been greatly shaken by a letter from Dr. Robert Stein, who when he went north to explore the coast of the continent of Greenland, took a large quantity of mail for Sverdrup and his men.

Sverdrup had distinctly announced his intention to explore the archipelago north of Greenland and trace the unknown part of the east coast of that island.

It is not surprising, therefore, that the complete northern coast, which has never yet been discovered by a single vessel.

This passage, so long sought for in vain, is known to exist only because one vessel from Berlin saw another one from Jones Sound.

The fact is, however, that all guesses as to Sverdrup's whereabouts are futile.
