Washington, March 24.—In spite of the surface indications that peace in China and the preservation of the territorial integrity of that great empire seems assured through the alliance of Great Britain and Japan and the joint declaration of Russia and France looking to the attainments of these ends, the diplomatic situation is regarded here with the greatest concern.

That Russia and France, on the one hand and England and Japan on the other are preparing themselves to meet whatever may come is learned on authority so thoroughly trustworthy that it cannot be susceptible of doubt.

The Balm of First Impression.

When this government was informed that England and Japan had entered into a coalition to preserve the integrity of the Chinese empire, the impression created on the minds of the American people was that it marked a distinct advance in the interest of peace between the powers.

Talk of Adjourning.

The spring-like weather has caused the question of adjournment to be freely agitated. In the senate, the trend of the talk is for adjournment April 10.

Russia and France Pledged.

In furnishing copies of their joint declaration to the secretary of state, neither Russia nor France asked for any expression of opinion in regard to that momentous communication.
