Cotton Seed Oil One of the Most Important Elements.

MOST POWERFUL IS ALLBRIGHT

From Chicago He Issues All the Uniform Lists of Prices.

Special to The Journal.

Chicago, April 17.—This morning's Record-Herald says: "In a modest little office at 575 Broadway building is centered a power which not only compels every American citizen and many foreigners to bow to its dictum, but which also recently compelled the leading railroads of the country to fee to the protection of the United States courts. This power is vested in W. B. Albright, secretary of the combination of the leading lard producers of the country, and from his office are issued the uniform price lists upon which the producers have agreed."

Mr. Albright bears the reputation of being one of the two greatest experts on cotton seed oil in the country, and to him has fallen the task of assisting in the fixing of the standard of grades of this product, as adopted by the Interstate Crushers' association, and approved of by cotton seed oil producers everywhere. With Henry Bausher he constitutes the government board for the northwestern states of the crushers' association, and aids in the naming of arbitrators in all cases of dispute between buyer and seller in the territory of all oil, seed cake or other product of the southern cotton seed crushers.

Current high prices of lard have caused an immense increase in the consumption of lard substitute. Chief of these is compound lard, so called, which is composed of 85 per cent cotton seed oil and of beef fat and oleomargarin in about equal quantities to make up the remaining 15 per cent. Mr. Albright's knowledge enables him to determine exactly the proportion of grain or loss that should properly follow in cotton seed oil, and to advance or decline fixed for prime steam lard by the big manufacturers whom he represents. Ordinarily the discount from the pure lard price is 1/2 cent a pound for the compound.

DEALERS AGGRIEVED

Chicago Butchers and Grocers Love Not the Beef Trust.

Chicago, April 17.—To the big packers who have been holding in reserve their large herds of steers on their western ranches, and to the fact that ranchmen have been disposing of their calves, expected to recoup their holdings at the expense of Mexican cattle raisers, which expectation has not been realized, are assigned the severity and the consequent high prices of beef by the Butchers and Grocers' association. Curt references were made at the regular meeting to the "beef trust," which has forced the ranchmen by buying up all the beef offered for sale by the dealers while curtailing its own for higher prices. A warning was also sounded that the next article to go up in price would be soap.

Two Tracks Across U. S. Matter With Miles

Washington, April 17.—It is impossible to perceive of any politics coming out of the enforced retirement of General Miles. The trouble lies in the fact that Miles, as commanding general of the army, does not realize that his position is one of courtesy, rather than of real authority or responsibility. Two Tracks Across U. S.

BY THE VANDERBILT SYSTEM

Double Track Now Extends From New York to Omaha—Work Being Extended.

Special to The Journal.

Chicago, April 17.—A double track railroad system is now possessed by the Vanderbilts between New York and Omaha, and by the end of two years, it is said, the dual line will have been extended to the Pacific coast.

The last rail of the double track of the North-Western between Chicago and Omaha was laid last week. This final piece of construction was between Missouri Valley and DeLeon, Iowa. It completed the first double track road between Chicago and Omaha and will be of immense advantage to all the Vanderbilt lines as well as the North-Western.

Work on finishing a second track for the Burlington road between Chicago and Omaha is being pushed and within the next six months it will have a double track between the two cities.

14.8 MILES IN 9 MINUTES

Fast Time Made on Burlington by Regular Train.

Denver, April 17.—Details of a run of 14.8 miles on the western division of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy railway at the rate of nearly 100 miles an hour have been made public by P. S. Bustis, passenger traffic manager of the Burlington lines. On the train while it was setting a new world's record for fifteen miles and upwards were H. C. Bush, traffic manager of the Colorado Midland railway, Mr. Lindsay of Pittsburgh, mayor of Andrew Carnegie, and a party of seventeen, and Arthur Johnson of Akron. The run was made by train No. 6, east-bound, which left Denver March 24, behind time. A heavy wind prevailed to Akron, 112 miles from Denver, and the train was thirty minutes behind at that point. In order to make up time a heavy head of steam was put on and between Eckley and Wray, a distance of 14.8 miles, the remarkable time of nine minutes was made—a rate of 98.7 miles an hour. "It is the fastest time ever made for a run of any length," said Mr. Bustis.

HOMESEEKERS' RATES

Will Be Continued Through May—Movement This Week.

Home-seekers' rates will be continued through May by the western lines, special round-trip tickets to coast points selling on May 6 and May 20. The large April movement is cited by railroad men as an indication that travel will continue heavy next month and that hundreds will take advantage of the extension of the rates.

The homeseeker movement this week was large. Northern Minnesota received a good share of it.

COLUMBIA FELLOWSHIPS

Thirty-eight were awarded, each carrying an annual stipend of \$500 or more. The successful candidates come from twenty states and territories, almost half of them west of the Mississippi river. Among the awards are:

University Fellowships, in chemistry, Hal Beans of Moscow, Idaho; in administrative law, Harold Bowman of Des Moines, Iowa; in Greek, Stephen Herbut of Madison, Wis.; in physiology, James Miner, of Berlin, Wis.; in zoology, Raymond Osborne of Fargo, N. D.
