GOLF COSTUME EFFECTS LESS SEVERE FOR 1902

Costumes of Miss Griscom and Mrs. Fox at Palm Beach Authoritative Models.

The costumes worn by Miss Griscom and Mrs. Coleb Fox at the golf tournament at Palm Beach were decidedly the most pretty and becoming costumes worn by any of the many prominent women players there. Miss Griscom is so vigorously graceful in any one of her many smart suits that she forms a decidedly pleasing contrast to another noted Philadelphia enthusiast of the same game, whose mannish habits, athletic stride and loud suits are a source of mild amusement to her many acquaintances. Of course, any soft or tennis costume is more or less mannish, yet this season there is a decided tendency to less severe effects than last year. For her all-round useful suit Miss Griscom wore a gray mixed tweed, quite light in tone. The natty little jacket was of the blouse effect, right-fitting in the back, and just a trifle loose in front. With this she usually wore a stunning plaid fannel shirt of either pink or green combinations. The plaids for these shirts are this year so wonderfully artistic in coloring that even the most prejudiced cannot but admire and wear them. The regulation patterns, so long known as Scotch plaids, are relegated to the back shelf by all up-to-date

haberdashers, and these daintily colored wash flannels have been selected to take their place. Being judiciously mixed with a small amount of cotton, these flannels wash to perfection, preserving both their color and quality after any amount of rubbing. But to return to Miss Griscom. Her hat was most often a soft, broad-brimmed gray felt, with a ribbon to match her shirt. And for gloves she sported those new undressed gray gloves, with oblong holes over each knuckle for ventilation, the palms being made of tan leather. On cool days Mrs. Fox, who so generally affects white in all her costumes, was arrayed in a white wool gown of coarse weave most aptly trimmed with stitched bands of white leather. These adorned the skirt in lengthwise strappings, and on the waist appeared as simulated Norfolk plaits, collar, cuffs and belt. The hat she liked best was one of those white canvas affairs, perfectly plain, except for the black facing, which certainly was a great protection against the brilliant glare of the southern sunshine. On sombre days her costume was quite as striking, being of the white and black shepherd's plaid in a small size. With this she wore a red and white corded striped pique shirt, a white choker and the dearest little red cheviot Norfolk jacket that any one could possibly desire. It had the plaits back and front, but the belt only extended over the hips, and the fronts were loose enough to allow Mrs. Fox to wear one of the new white blouse sweaters beneath it at times. Indeed, these sweaters have become an indispensable part of every golfer's wardrobe. The stocks that have been selected as the best form for golfing this season are the ascot, the Tantiy cravat, the narrow four-in-hand, and the multi stock. The four-in-hand is generally all white, both tie and stock, and of pique or some of the soft cotton materials. Stiff, white pique stocks in a variety of stripes have either white bows or those of madras of a narrow stripe. A decided novelty is a stock of white pique with the little colorlets of some plain colored linen and the bow to match. The ascot is made of cotton gauze, of mercerized cotton in stripes, of Japanese silk, and of pongee in the natural color embroidered with small figures in a contrasting shade. Any one of them is stylish, and all are made with the white stock collar. The patent-leather belt of narrow width is good, especially when the shoes are of patent leather, which is considered quite the most correct thing in the way of shoes this season. For those who do not care for patent leather there are those of the dull mat. kid, of calf or of canvas, for low tan shoes are seen. The openwork, basket-weave belt of some pale shade or white, with a small gilt buckle, is pretty for 65 cents. The soft ribbon belt, with some fancy buckle of gold or silver, is also much worn, the coloring of the ribbon generally matching that worn on the hat and in the tie.
