DELL RAPIDS—Because land is more valuable for crops than for ball grounds and race track purposes the track here will have to be abandoned.



shipping a little over 2,000,000 tons as was the case last season, the Eastern is preparing to ship 4,000,000 tons of iron ore this year. A good start has already been made. The Eastern Minnesota is so high that for a half a mile before the water line is reached there had to be an immense trestle built so that the engines can get to the dock of the dock. In this structure there were originally placed 14,000,000 feet of Washington fir for the superstructure and timber work. There were 14,000 pieces of piling driven in the building of the dock and 4,000 separate piles. This shows the vast amount of material that is taken to erect a shipping monster of this character. Old time ore docks in this region ran from 47 to 55 feet in height and now they are from 60 to 73 feet, the latter being attained only by the Eastern's big structure.
