SUNDAY IN CAMP

Guests Entertained and Services Held—Late Range Scores.

CAMP LAKEVIEW, LAKE CITY, MINN.—While Sunday did not bring many visitors to camp, those that were here heartily enjoyed themselves as it was a model day.
