King Has Really Been Seriously Ill Since June 14.

EFFORT TO POSTPONE COLLAPSE

Old Prophecy That He Would "Reign but Never Be Crowned" Worries the King Much.

London, June 25.—It may well be stated openly now the fact, which has been known for several days past, that the king has been critically ill for more than a week.

Attacked June 14.

The king had been in fairly good health and spirits until June 14. He was free from the continuous round of functions and extremely nervous over the many weeks of bad weather, which had spoiled many of his plans.

Collapse in Mind and Body.

It was this interference that wore out the endurance of Lord Carrington, the lord chamberlain, and caused him to retire during the heavy downpour at Aldershot soon after the coronation on June 14.

A Light Stroke of Paralysis.

The system of twitching of the muscles of the face alarmed Sir Francis Laking, and Sir Thomas Barlow, the English specialist in paralytic affections, was summoned. When he arrived he described as a light stroke of paralysis on Tuesday afternoon was really very slight, but the patient was very weak physically.

Operation to Save Life.

It was really against the physicians' advice that the king returned to London Monday. His reason for insisting was that such a radical change in the plans would cause alarm among the people.

Fearing to Alarm People.

A consultation was speedily held and it was quickly decided that the coronation ceremony could not take place at present and that a prompt operation was the only course available to save the king's life.
