NORTH DAKOTA TOPICS

H. L. Holmes, the Bathgate banker, is understood to have the Pembina county delegation for state auditor, always on the condition, of course, that Jud LaMoure does not go gunning for a place on the ticket. In spite of the fact that LaMoure is said to want nothing but his old seat in the senate, North Dakota political promoters have their suspicions. A close friend of Senator Hansbrough said a few days ago that LaMoure could have Hansbrough's support for governor, if the Pembina chief would give assurance that the patronage of the governor's office would not be used against Hansbrough in the senatorial fight.

some of the Grifton and Minto insurgents with the west and crowd having resulted in the defeat of old timers like Driscoll and Roger Allen. There is a suggestion in this that Jud LaMoure will have something to say about how the Walsh county vote is placed. He was the principal patron of some of the insurgents who are now in the saddle while the bitter fight against Driscoll was on two years ago. It is said that Frank Sprague grew tired of politics after his experience at the Grand Forks convention in 1899. He does not figure in this year's roll of honor from Walsh county. Walsh county wants Libby for attorney general or Brown "for a place on the ticket."

It is generally understood by men in close touch with the present democratic managers that a determined effort will be made in the convention to put the party on record for re-submission, and it is believed that this will be successful.

Most of the big wheels in the North Dakota republican machine frankly say that Major J. S. Murphy of Minto is going against the buzz saw in his efforts to be named lieutenant governor. It is believed that Lieutenant Governor Bartlett will have the support of most of the delegations without much effort. It is represented that Bartlett has slipped the office very acceptably, and although Murphy has won the Ward county delegation he will have trouble in forming a strong alliance in his part of the state on account of his anti-Hansbrough proclivities.

While the men who beat A. C. McGillivray out in Stark county are celebrating the event, Editor Tuttle of the Mandan Pioneer reminds them that crowing may be in bad form, as McGillivray is a long way from being politically dead. There is as much uncertainty in Stark county politics as in old-time Grand Forks foot race. It is a novel thing for people in North Dakota to be reading the name of McGillivray in the column of "also rans." Tuttle's reminder that there is another time coming is worthy of consideration. McGillivray is a lively political corpse.
