Big Yield Figured by N. Y. Produce Exchange Man.

WHEAT 833,500,000 BUSHELS

Against a Yield Last Year of 745,460,218 Bu.—Some "Early Bird" Figures.

New York Sun Special Service. New York, July 11.—J. C. Brown, statistician of the New York Produce Exchange, calculated to-day that the figures of the government crop report indicate a harvest of 852,339,000 bushels of winter wheat, which compares with an actual harvest last year of 429,675,149 bushels.

THE TAKING OF MANILA

General Anderson Differs From Admiral Dewey.

Chicago, July 11.—General Thomas M. Anderson, who served with the army before Manila, styles Admiral Dewey's Philippine capital was the result of an agreement as "misleading." Writing from the National Soldiers' home at Sandusky, Ohio, Anderson says: "No doubt the admiral and General Merritt both thought that they had made an agreement with the Spanish authorities by which the city could be taken without bloodshed. Yet the fact remains that Captain General Augustin was relieved because he was willing to make such a capitulation, while his successor refused to do so."
