REV. J. J. KEANE GOES TO CHEYENNE

The New Diocese of Lead, S. D., to Be Directed by Rev. J. N. Starbuck of St. Paul

Rev. James J. Keane, of Minneapolis, pastor of the Church of the Immaculate Conception becomes bishop of Cheyenne, Wyoming.

Rev. J. N. Starbuck, of St. Paul, vicar general of the Catholic archdiocese of St. Paul and pastor of the Church of St. Francis Xavier, is made bishop of the new diocese of Lead, S. D.

The appointment of bishop is effective upon official notification from the archbishop of the diocese of St. Paul.
