

BRYAN AND SOME OTHERS

Democrats Have a Fish and Lobster Time on Massachusetts Bay.

Letter From Senator Bailey and an Address by Mr. Bryan.

Nantasket, Mass., July 24.—In a great tent on the shore of Massachusetts bay for hours to-day a throng of men, and not a few women, listened to distinguished orators from various parts of the United States as they delivered addresses upon the principal political issues of the day from the democratic point of view.

The speech making followed a banquet, the first to be given by the recently organized New England Democratic League, in the Rockland hotel, at which about 300 were present. The entire program was intended to give the league, the membership of which now numbers many of the leading democrats of New England, a fitting introduction to the public.

To this end the list of speakers was made as notable as possible. Senator Bailey, mayor of Boston, as presiding officer, and William J. Bryan, Edward M. Shepard, New York, and Senator E. W. Carmack of Tennessee to make addresses. Senator J. W. Bailey of Texas was expected to attend, but he sent a letter after the first of the New England states. We expect to elect a democrat in ex-Speaker Reed's district in Maine and also to get one district in Rhode Island. There will be no issue of silver or gold.

The hour scheduled for the banquet was 1 o'clock, and it was planned that the public exercises should begin at that hour. The distinguished guests did not reach Boston until this forenoon. For an hour or more following breakfast, Mr. Bryan was "at home" to a few friends at the hotel. There was no public reception.

At 10 o'clock Mr. Bryan went to Tremont temple to address the New England Protective association. The other members of the party occupied the time in various ways, and shortly after 11 o'clock, under escort of the committee, the visitors went to the hotel where they embarked for Nantasket. On arrival there the party proceeded at once to the Rockland house.

After the banquet the program of letters and addresses followed. A letter from Senator Bailey of Texas was read in which he said: "I sincerely hope the occasion will be successful as its promoters could wish. The democrats of New England have always been loyal to the great and fundamental principles of the democratic party, and in spite of our recent differences with them over some economic questions, I am delighted to find that they earnestly desire to bring about a union that will turn their success to our party. Without yielding any of my convictions upon disputed questions, I am ready to welcome every democrat back into the ranks of the party. I only demand of them that they will bow to the will of the majority and support the nominees of our next national convention. All democratic principles and permanent principles of our government and they ought to be willing to submit their differences over issues, however important, to the assembled wisdom of the party, and abide by its decision without reservation. Upon no other basis can any organization be maintained and there is no organization to which this test can be so easily applied as the democratic party of the United States. I have been pleased to call the fundamental principles of the government and surely it ought to be the duty of every democrat to subordinate their difference upon issues of a day or of a decade, and sit cordially around the same table. Trusting that your banquet may serve to impress this truth upon the minds of democrats in every part of the union, I am, very respectfully yours, J. W. Bailey."

Senator Carmack opened his speech with a tribute to the democratic party of New England, which, he said, all through these years had dauntlessly faced "the brutal republican majorities that exist and persist in this section of the country. The party, like one of old, has always risen with renewed strength and courage from regular biennial contact with the earth."

After dwelling at considerable length upon the alleged departure of the republican party of to-day from the landmarks set by its founders, Senator Carmack declared that the concentration of wealth and power in the hands of a few men threatened the future of the republic. Adverting to what he termed the "new republicanism" of the present, he said: "The republican party has enthroned the trusts and made plutocracy supreme in the United States, he proved a powerful ally for the democratic party."

"The president," continued senator Carmack, "is now engaged in terrific and illegal attack upon the trusts. I have always understood it the duty of the president to advise congress what measures are necessary. But he waits until congress adjourns and tells the people what he intends to have enacted by some other congress at some other time. If," the speaker said further, "you wish to do effectively with monopoly, if you want to suppress the trusts, you must put a party in power that means to do it. We know the republican party will not even try."

The speaker censured the military administration in the Philippines for cruelties inflicted upon non-combatants and for the employment of Macabebes. Mr. Shepard said in part: "It is good for us to affirm the larger, underlying creed upon which national policies are ripe for practical and present decision by the American people at the congressional elections. We do need in doing this to regard the differences of democratic leaders. For democrats equally sincere, patriotic and intelligent have always differed, and differed widely upon practical and present applications of a party creed to which all were devoted."

After alluding to issues on which the democratic party had differed and become reconciled in past years, Mr. Shepard continued: "Now, the later differences over the extent to which silver may be coined at the mint or over the treaty with Spain or over...

CALL ON MILITIA

Frightful Outrages Perpetrated on Shepherds by Rival Cattle Men.

Lander, Wyo., July 24.—It is learned that in addition to killing a Mexican shepherd named Sam Salaxa, and slaughtering several thousand sheep, a band of 150 masked men surrounded all the sheep camps and forced the sheep men to abandon their flocks.

After killing one herd numbering some 2,000 sheep, twenty-five other herds, amounting to about 65,000 sheep, were driven to the mountains and left to shift for themselves. The shepherds have been threatened with instant death if they go after their flocks.

The sheep are now the prey of wild animals, and if they escape this death the loss will be very heavy, as they are almost all weas and lambs.

The scene of the lawlessness is 115 miles west of Lander, in Fremont county. The sheriff is powerless and the militia will be called out to protect the shepherds.

VIVEKANANDA IS DEAD

THE HINDO PHILOSOPHER-MONK

His Teachings Became Prominent in the United States After the World's Fair.

New York, July 24.—Private advice from Calcutta announce the death in a monastery near there of Swami Vivekananda, the Hindu monk and philosopher who reached himself into New York in 1893 for the World's Fair.

His original mission here was as a delegate to the parliament of religions at the world's fair. He remained long in the city and was over in response to invitations by prominent members of the "higher thought" movement in this country who were greatly impressed by his teachings.

ANOTHER OPERATION

The King's Rally Is Said to Be Temporary.

London, July 24.—A high court official who has seen the king many times since the operation, says that if the king gets through the postponed coronation it will be only with the utmost precaution.

"It's quite likely," adds this official, "that the king will not go to London till the night the coronation is held, and afterward will immediately return to Cowes."

"The operation, which was far more serious and complicated than any one has been led to believe, was performed under conditions involving a large portion of the intestinal cavity."

"The operation removed the immediate danger, and gave a chance for a rally, which the king wonderfully availed himself of. But the conditions are still such that a second operation is only a question of time."

"The operation will probably be performed in the autumn. Of the king's chances for the second operation the doctors are unwilling to predict."

THE SULTAN

ARRESTED

Ruler of Binadayan Held as a Hostage by Capt. Pershing.

Moros Who Attacked Two Americans Will Have to Be Given Up.

Manila, July 24.—Captain John J. Pershing of the Fifteenth cavalry, who is in command of the Lanao (Mindanao) expedition, has arrested the Sultan of Binadayan

as a hostage for the delivery to him of the Moros who on June 22 attacked two Americans.

The sultan offered to produce the dead body of a relative of the Moro leader and to surrender ten slaves, but Captain Pershing refused to entertain the suggestion. The sultan then ordered his followers to produce the guilty Moros.

On Tuesday one of the guilty men was brought into the camps of the Americans. He was horribly mutilated. Before dying he confessed having participated in the ambush of the Americans.

Pershing, the leader of the attack, has fortified his house and defies the Sultan of Binadayan's followers to capture him.

HE "DUCKED" NATIVES Lieutenant Edwin Hickman Believed to Have Been Acquitted.

Manila, July 24.—The court martial of Lieutenant Edwin A. Hickman of the First cavalry on the charge of having ducked in a pond two natives of Tayabas because they refused to guide him to the stronghold of the insurgent leader Camar, and with having ducked a third native, who died from the maltreatment, has been concluded after two brief sittings and production of the evidence. The defense also produced a telegraphic order from General Chaffee urging the location of Cabales, regardless of the measures necessary to do so. The desire to shift responsibility to the defense, testified that Major Gardner was responsible for the charges against Lieutenant Hickman.

HIGH COURAGE Hospital Corps Privates Who Give Their Lives as Choiera Nurses.

Washington, July 24.—Surgeon General Forwood has received the following orders, issued in the Philippines recently: The death of Private Joseph G. M. Egan, hospital corps, U. S. A., is announced. Private Egan was detailed to face death as a cholera nurse for one of our comrades and died of the disease, caught from his charge; an example of devotion to duty to be held up for all men to emulate.

Private Leonard B. Stevenson, hospital corps, U. S. A., was detailed to nurse three of his comrades with the knowledge that his charges had been stricken while performing the same duty. Without a murmur he responded and remained until the sick were cured and returned to the front. He was decorated with the Purple Heart for his gallant service.

DR. AMES IS

NOT MAYOR

City Attorney Rules He Has No Authority While Away.

Fred Ames' Return Predicted for Monday—What His Indictment Charges.

Mayor Ames, while in a measure directing the operations of the police department from his retreat at West Baden, Ind., and, in law, still chief executive of the city, is not the de facto mayor and cannot have the privilege of exercising the functions of the office. Alderman Fred Powers, by virtue of his office as vice president of the council, is, in the absence of President Jones, the legal acting mayor and upon him devolves the duty of signing warrants, resolutions and ordinances.

This is the substance of a ruling made by City Attorney Frank Healy in response to Mayor Ames' telegram of yesterday afternoon addressed to City Clerk Lydiard, directing that all warrants, resolutions and ordinances that may be passed by the city council at its meeting tomorrow night be sent to him at West Baden.

This settles officially the interesting question who is the de facto mayor of Minneapolis in the present situation, and makes it plain that in the event of an emergency requiring official action, the police department would have to take its orders from some other person than the sick man at West Baden.

What the Charter Says. The city attorney's ruling was contained in a letter sent to Mayor Ames last night, and is as follows: "Mr. Lydiard has just presented me with your telegram of this date in which you ask that he send resolutions and ordinances for your signature to West Baden. I have advised Mr. Lydiard that this is unnecessary and in fact the city charter provides otherwise. Chapter 3, section 2 of the charter provides as follows: Sec. 2.
